## In Remembrance of Him—Tonight

On the eve of His crucifixion, Jesus ate the Passover Supper with His disciples. The Passover was observed each year and reminded the Jews of how God brought His people out of Egypt.

As Jesus and His disciples ate the Passover Supper together, Jesus used the bread and wine as symbols for His body and blood and demonstrated how His body would be broken and His blood shed for the sins of the world. The disciples did not have complete understanding, yet, Jesus instructed them to “do this in remembrance of Me.”

Tonight at 6 p.m. we will observe the Lord’s Supper “in remembrance of Him.” You may want to take time this afternoon

to read 1 Corinthians 11:17–34 and discuss the importance of proclaiming our Lord’s death with your children. Then come tonight prepared to look back on Christ’s life and death, while anticipating His second coming.


## Bible Fellowship Hour


This issue of integrating psychology with the Bible is one that all Christians must face since it concerns the nature of man and the sufficiency of Scripture.
