Marty and Marylinn Jetton

We never know when our last day on earth will be, but when the Savior calls, Marty and Marylinn Jetton are ready to go.

“I can hardly wait to see my Lord,” Marty said. “I can’t imagine how glorious it will be to see Him face to face.”

Marylinn added, “Marty and I talk about heaven all the time. We are lonesome for heaven and want to see our Savior and loved ones. We haven’t seen our daughter Kim for six years.”

“And yet,” Marty said, “we’re torn about leaving this world. We have loved ones that have not yet come to the Lord and many still need to hear about God’s Son.”

Marty and Marylinn celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary on June 25, 2015. Looking back they can see God brought them to Himself and how He has been molding them into the image of His Son.

According to Marty, he was a drinker the first 15 years of their marriage and said, “When I drank, I was Jekyll and Hyde.”

Marylinn agreed. “But, I would never leave Marty because I didn’t want my children to grow

up without him and when he was sober, he was his old self.”

Sensing that something was missing in her life, Marylinn attended a brunch with the Christian Women’s Club. “Suddenly the scales fell from my eyes and I saw myself for the sinner I am. I was crushed and broken and knew I needed the Savior. I asked Him to forgive me and I believed that He had died on the cross to pay the penalty for my sins. I was forgiven. I had peace with God.”

“My wife started putting tracts all over the house and talking about Jesus,” Marty said. “I was

skeptical, but, I did start reading *The Late, Great Planet Earth*. God was working on me. I would read passages to Marylinn and we'd be awestruck."

That summer the Jettons were invited to a picnic and Jim Moo-berry shared how God had worked in his life. At the end of the evening, Glen Govig asked Marty if he was going to heaven.

Marty said, "I hope so, my wife's been bugging me about it."

Glen Govig shared God's plan of salvation and Marty listened. "For the first time in my life I knew that I was a vile sinner," Marty said. "I knew I deserved to spend eternity in hell and that all of my good deeds were filthy rags to God. I prayed with Glen before I went home that night. I repented of my sins and believed in Jesus' finished work on the cross."

Driving home from the picnic, Marty told his wife that he had turned from his sins and believed in the Savior. Marylinn immediately burst into tears of joy.

Although Marty previously had not been able to quit smoking or drinking, he was able to quit with the Lord's help and said, "I was a new creature in Christ."

The Jettons began attending Temple Baptist and in 1973 they began attending Indian Hills. "We have been thrilled with the depth and clarity of the Bible teaching all these years and in all our travels

have never found a church that compared."

Now that Marty is unable to come to church, he and Marylinn stream the service over the internet. "We have only missed one sermon," Marylinn said.

Although Marty has Parkinson's-Plus, diabetes, blindness in one eye, neuropathy in his feet, and is persistently tired from all the medication, he is thankful! and his favorite hymn is "It is Well with My Soul" by Horatio Spaford.

Likewise, despite diabetes, arthritis and 24-hour-pain, Marylinn said, "The lost have no idea what they are missing. God is right here with me in the good times and the hard times." Her daily prayer is, "Lord, let me be a light for you."

Marty and Marylinn Jetton are now living at Legacy Estates #245 where the Lord's light shines brightly.
