Layered Rectangles

Jaime Scholnick uses left-over polystyrene packing materials, unaltered, to create statues reminiscent of artifacts of lost civilizations. The discarded becomes something desirable, questioning our behaviors, needs, and wants in this world of consumerism and permanent waste. The temporary function of the packaging stands in stark contrast to the longevity of the polystyrene material itself, another juxtaposition the artist draws attention to. Through its artistic use this fact might even be expanded upon, having future generations wonder about the meaning of these objects. Another take on the artifacts idea is Scholnick's *Chuckles* series, showing portraits of political figures just past their time in power, so being artifacts in their own right.
