A Bulgarian Photo Project

This collaborative photo project provides unusual views of life in Bulgaria today, as seen through the eyes of eight young people who have grown up in state-run orphanages.

Nine volunteers from the US and Bulgaria worked together for two months with eight youth in Bulgaria, of varying ethnicities and ages (16-23). The project began with a weekend retreat, involving art therapy, technical training and team building.

Each volunteer then paired off with one youth to help give him/her a voice and a medium for expression through photography. Each volunteer asked his/her younger partner: Where do you want to go and why? What is most interesting to you? What do you care about? And then they set off...

This collaborative journeying and artmaking was empowering. It built friendships, enhanced a sense of memory, identity and place, and helped these young people transition to adulthood.

Totka's photography focused on interiors and landscapes.




Vassilka chose to take pictures of people and places where she grew up. Because her great love is music, she had people sing for her, or talk about music, while she took pictures of them in their homes.





Ivaila's photography focused on sport, movement, play and friendship.







Ngyuen chose to take pictures of animals at the National Zoo and elsewhere in Sofia. She also took pictures of friends and of her workplace.



As a child she had problems with the joints of ther legs and spent two years undergoing treatment in hospitals. She now lives in Sofia and has recently been hired as a social worker to care for younger children, mostly orphans. She has moved out of her orphanage and is living in an apartment subsidized by her new job. Amazingly, she recently befriended several Vietnamese people living in Sofia who managed to track down two living relatives of hers in Vietnam: her grandmother (in picture on opposite page) and her aunt. Ngyuen hopes to learn Vietnamese and visit Vietnam someday to meet them.



Emilia Kosseva


Emilia took portraits of friends and colleagues at the local theater in Sofia where she works.



Naiden Iliev




