Night

“Press close bare-bosom’d night—press close magnetic nourishing night!
Night of south winds—night of the large few stars!
Still nodding night—mad naked summer night.” — Whitman

What is the magic of night? It appears in literature, poetry, opera, film and painting. Sometimes it is a place of death—sometimes a place of desire—sometimes both, however always a place of mystery. I first began painting these night paintings three years ago in the studio with the large *Bachanal (succor)*. It is an invention as are all the larger paintings. Using figure drawings that I scan into the computer I arrange the compositions. From these arrangements of drawings I find the connections, the rhythms, and the arabesques that link the figures. My ubiquitous Punchinello mask limns the relationships between single figures, couples and groups. From these groupings, glances and gestures, the narratives of desire, comfort, similarity and difference unfold. Over the last few summers I painted from life at night on the beaches of Wellfleet. My husband and I went to Cape Cod to care for my mother in her last years. I would go down to the beach after dark with pochade under my arm and spelunking light strapped to my head to paint the fires, the gatherings, and the night sky. At the end of each summer I would return to my studio with a group of premier coups. These paintings, along with my figure drawings, became the sources for my mad naked summer nights.
