### Parshas Chayei Sarah November 5, 2015

#### **Shabbos Corner:**

When one turns on the hot water faucet in a house, cold water immediately enters the hot water tank. This cold water comes into contact with the hot water already in the tank and it's heated up. So turning on the hot water faucet is a violation of Bishul (cooking the cold water). To get around this problem some people turn off the hot water switch, thinking this allows them to turn on the hot water faucet on Shabbos. This is not necessarily correct, because switching off the heating element does not prevent cold water from entering the tank when the hot water faucet is turned on. Since the water in the tank may still be hot even after the heater has turned off, the new water can still be cooked when it enters the tank. So you still can't turn on the hot water faucet even if the water heater is turned off. (Unless you turned it off at least 2 hours before Shabbos when the hot water will have cooled off). Some sinks have an instant hot water tap which operates as follows. A tank under the sink fills with water and becomes heated to just under boiling. As hot water is used and the tank is emptied, incoming cold water cools the remaining hot water, and the thermostat activates the electric heating element to heat the water. Therefore one cannot use an instant hot water tap on Shabbos.

#### **Kashrus Corner**

Q. In what situations does one have to wait six hours in order to eat dairy after meat?

A. Even if one chews meat, but does not swallow it you would have to wait 6 hours before you eat dairy. However, one who merely tastes meat with his tongue and then removes it from his mouth, one need not wait six hours. One who ate parve food cooked with meat, for instance potatoes or vegetables from chicken soup, must wait six hours to eat dairy. For parve foods that were cooked in a meat pot without meat, one could eat dairy products right away, after eating the parve food. And if the meat pot was not used with hot meat for the past 24 hours (non Ben-Yomo) then one may eat the parve food that was in that meat pot even together with dairy. Nevertheless, one optimally should not cook parve food in a non Ben-Yomo meat pot if he plans to eat the food with dairy. However, this is only true if you have a parve pot to cook in; otherwise one could use a non ben-Yomo pot to cook parve food in it to then eat it with dairy.
