The Talmud tells us (Bava Metzia 59A), Rav Chelbo says a person should always be careful of his wife's honor, for there is no blessing in a person's home except in his wife's merit. As the verse states (in this week's parsha) "and he treated Abraham well for her sake" (Lech Lecha 12:16). This is when Pharoah gave a great deal of wealth to Abraham. So if that's true, the verse should say in 12:16, and "Pharoah treated Abraham well"; but it doesn't mention Pharoah. The answer is, the Torah is telling us that G-d made sure that Abraham was treated well because of Sarah, meaning that because Abraham treated his wife Sarah properly he was rewarded with wealth. That's why the Talmud goes on to say that Rabbah advised the men to honor their wives, for in that merit they would become wealthy.
