## The Weekly Parsha



### Parshas Vayigash

**“it will happen that when he (Yaakov) sees that the youth (Binyamin) is missing, he will die, and your servants will have brought down the hoariness of your servant our father in sorrow to the grave.” (44:31)**

In pleading for mercy from Yosef, Yehudah stressed the fact that if Binyamin remained in Egypt as a slave and didn't return with them, their father Yaakov would suffer greatly and may even die from the agony. Why did Yehudah mention only the pain which would be caused to their father over the loss of a beloved son and made no mention of the intense pain that would be caused to Binyamin's 10 sons over the loss of their unique and irreplaceable father?

The Kotzker Rebbe derives from here that the love of a father for every single one of his 12 children is greater than the collective love of all 10 children for their one and only father! Rav Dessler writes that contrary to common wisdom, feelings of love toward another person are generated not by receiving from that person but by giving to him. As any parent can attest, raising a child is an opportunity like no other to constantly give of oneself to help another person who is unable to help himself. The tremendous feelings of love generated by such extreme and continuous giving are unmatched and unparalleled, as Yehudah explained to Yosef!

**“And Yosef said to his brothers, ‘I am Yosef. Is my father still alive?’ But his brothers could not answer him because they were left disconcerted before him.” (45:3)**

When Yosef's brothers came to Egypt to purchase food during the years of famine, he was able to recognize them immediately, but after 22 years of separation they were unable to identify him. As a result, he was able to subject them to a dramatic and frightening series of events. After accusing them of being spies, he incarcerated Shimon in order to force them to return with his beloved maternal brother Binyamin. After confusing them by inviting them to join with him at a banquet, he had his goblet planted in Binyamin's sack in order to frame him for stealing.

Finally, when Yehudah pleaded for mercy, explaining how much their father Yaakov

would suffer if they failed to return with Binyamin, Yosef was unable to hold himself back anymore. He ordered all of his Egyptian officers and servants out of the room and revealed his true identity to his brothers, telling them, “I am Yosef. Is my father still alive?”

The entire episode and ordeal of the brothers' encounter with Yosef appeared so illogical and nonsensical as to seem more like a bad dream than reality, yet in a split second, in just two words, ani Yosef – I am Yosef – suddenly the entire picture became crystal clear. All of the seemingly inexplicable events and details fell into place, and everything made perfect sense.

The history of the Jewish nation has been fraught with lofty highs and awful lows. The life of every individual Jew follows a similar pattern. Many happy events seem too good to be true, while many struggles seem too great to bear. Certainly, there seems to be no rhyme or reason to them, no interconnecting links weaving them together as part of a larger picture and greater plan. The Chofetz Chaim writes that just as with Yosef's brothers, there will come a time when we will merit Hashem's revelation in all of His glory and splendor. Upon hearing just two words, ani Hashem – I am Hashem – everything will immediately fall into place, and all of our questions will vanish into thin air.

**“Then he fell upon his brother Binyamin's neck and wept; and Binyamin wept upon his neck.” (45:14)**

After Yosef revealed his true identity to his brothers, he and Binyamin fell upon each other's necks and wept. Rashi explains that they were mourning the Holy Temples and Mishkan which would be built in the portions of Israel to be inherited by their descendants which would eventually be destroyed.

There was once an old woman who passed away. In her will, she left instructions to split her estate equally among her grandchildren, except for an additional \$10,000 which was to be given to one of her granddaughters on top of her regular portion.

The reason for this preferential treatment was that later in life, the grandmother decided to open up and share with her family her bitter personal story of the travails she endured in surviving the Holocaust. In contrast to the rest of the grandchildren who sat stoically listening, this particular granddaughter cried profusely at the tales of her grandmother's tortuous pain and suffering. In recognition of her compassion and empathy, the grandmother allotted her more than all of the others.

Rav Yitzchok Zilberstein derives from here that if a flesh-and-blood grandmother gives additional money as a reflection of the special bond that she feels with the granddaughter who cried upon hearing of her suffering, how much

more will Hashem feel connected to us for every tear that we shed over His pain at the destruction of the Beis Hamikdash, and how much unfathomable reward will we receive.

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## The Power of Rebuke

Parshas Vayigash begins with Yehudah standing before Yosef, the Viceroy of Mitzraim, pleading with him for the release of Binyamin. Overwhelmed by his emotions, Yosef clears the room, and responds with perhaps the most climactic verse in the entire Sefer Bereishis, “I am Yosef, is my father still alive?” When he reveals his true identity to his brothers, they are literally speechless, as the pasuk concludes with “But his brothers could not answer him because they were left disconcerted before him” (Bereishis 45:3). Rashi explains that they were “disconcerted before him” because of the “shame of what they had done to him” (Tanchuma 5).

Abba Kohen Bardela said: “Woe to us, for the day of judgment! Woe to us, for the day of rebuke!... Yosef was younger than his brothers, yet they could not stand before his rebuke... When HaKodesh Baruch Hu will come to rebuke each person according to what he is, how much more so” (Bereishis Rabbah 93:10). R' Asher Weiss writes that “the best mussar is nothing more than the revelation of the inescapable truth, which is so startlingly obvious, that it cannot possibly be denied.”

Try and imagine, if you will, the plethora of thoughts and emotions that must have been frantically passing through the brothers' minds as Yosef revealed himself to them! The utter shock and bewilderment that this seemingly cruel Mitzri was really their long lost brother Yosef. The sheer terror and gripping fear of retribution for their mistreatment of him so many years ago. And, of course, the undeniable shame that they must have felt for throwing Yosef into a pit, turning a deaf ear to his pleas for mercy, selling him into slavery, fabricating his death, and the misery that they caused their grieving father for twenty-two years.

On the *p'shat* level, this statement hardly seems like a rebuke at all; rather Yosef simply revealed himself to his brothers and inquired after the welfare of his father. It seems to be a simple statement and question, but R' Asher Weiss delves deeper, and describes a very different scenario. “Yosef did indeed rebuke his brothers; not for their deed, but for who they were, and for the character traits that they had displayed. ‘My father,’ he said; not ‘Our father.’ This was a subtle, but biting rebuke to them, for having been so cold and heartless toward their father. For twenty-two years, they

had stood by their father's side and seen him mourn inconsolably for his lost son. What sort of children were they? This was perhaps the harshest rebuke of all. The recognition of fault in one's very character can be much more shocking than the recognition of a faulty deed, no matter how terrible it was."

It seems that with Yosef's statement, the "moment of truth" had finally arrived. The brothers were now confronted with the severity of their crimes not only against Yosef, but against their father as well. As a result of this self-actualization, the brothers were mortified and left speechless, unable to utter a single word in their own defense.

The words of Abba Kohen Bardela serve as a reminder to us all that the "Day of Judgment" is imminent. Our day will surely come when we will be forced to make an accounting of our lives, not only for our deeds, but also for our very character. How could we possibly be able to withstand His rebuke? By examining ourselves now, and taking advantage of the opportunity that Hashem is giving us to work on refining our character and improving our ways. What is our attitude, and how do we treat others? There is always room for improvement, and today can be the first day of the rest of our lives!

At the end of his essay, R' Asher Weiss concludes with, "May Hashem grant us, for the sake of His Holy Name, that we merit to correct our deeds and our characters, to serve Him with wholehearted love." I second that notion. A gutten Shabbos to all.
