Bais Medrash Renovation

It is with much pleasure and excitement that we announce a major new construction project for Tiferes Yisroel. With G-d's help we will embark upon a mission to expand and beautify the upstairs Bais Medrash. This will involve building a space directly above the "sunroom" of the main shul. Upstairs on the second floor, we will knock down the wall of the Bais Medrash facing Pinkney Road and build out over the sunroom adding 50 percent more space to our Bais Medrash. At the same time, we will redecorate the Bais Medrash with a new look, additional bookshelves and seforim. The main sanctuary will not be affected or altered.

We have enlisted the services of our friend Bernie Schulman as our contractor. Our long-time shul member Bob Rosenfelt will be helping with the site plans and drawings. Bob is a former president of the shul and was our outstanding building chairman when we built our current shul. Much thanks to Bob and Bernie.

Our dear friends and members Drs. Ed and Mesa Leventhal will be dedicating the new Bais Medrash renovation in memory of Ed's parents, Harry B. and Sylvia Leventhal a"h. Much thanks and appreciation to Ed and Mesa for their support and generosity. Yaakov and Ester Gur have also given generously to the expansion project to help us get started. Thank you to Yaakov and Ester for your support and generosity.


Rabbi Goldberger will be starting the fundraising effort in the very near future to raise the additional amount necessary for the project, and a smaller amount to paint the inside of the shul building and take care of a few other areas which need attention. The total amount of the project is \$75,000.

Our shul has not conducted a capital campaign since we bought and built our current shul building 19 years ago and we have not had a building fund since then as well. Please remember that the funds being raised are completely separate from shul operating funds.

The Weekly Parsha



Servant Sisters

from the teachings of the Lubavitcher Rebbe;
adapted by Moshe Yaakov Wisnefsky

She [Rachel] gave [Jacob] her handmaid Bilhah as a wife. (Gen. 30:4)

She [Leah] took her handmaid Zilpah and gave her to Jacob as a wife. (Gen. 30:9)

Bilhah and Zilpah were sisters. Nonetheless, in marrying them, Jacob did not violate the Torah's prohibition of marrying two sisters, since they did not have the legal status of sisters. Bilhah and Zilpah were the daughters of Laban's maidservants, and according to Jewish law were thus considered his property, devoid of any familial status.

Spiritually, every Jew is, in a sense, a servant of G-d. Not only does his property belong to G-d, his very existence belongs to G-d. This aspect of our relationship to G-d is in a way superior to the son-father aspect of our relationship to G-d. When we consider our relationship to G-d like that of a child to his father, i.e., when we fulfill G-d's will out of love for G-d, our self-awareness is a factor in the relationship: the more we sense how much we love G-d, the more we desire to fulfill His will. In contrast, when we serve G-d as a servant, our service is pure; there is no admixture of self-awareness, for we are merely the "property" of our Master.

Through this attitude, the Jew becomes an extension of the King, and reveals to the world the sovereignty of G-d.

In Kabbala, the Hebrew word for "iron," "barzel," is seen as an acronym for the four wives of Jacob: Bilhah, Rachel, Zilpah, and Leah. Significantly, the names of the maidservants appear before those of their mistresses. This reflects the fact that the maidservants were, in a sense, superior to the matriarchs. The matriarchs personified malchut of Atzilut as it is in its native environment, the world of Atzilut. The maidservants, on the other hand, personified malchut of Atzilut as it descends into the lower worlds. This is why Abraham and Jacob did not initially want to marry their maidservants: they did not want to be brought into the lower worlds. The matriarchs, however, recognized the need for this descent and therefore encouraged their husbands to marry their maidservants. Precisely because they descended into the lower worlds, they were able to reconstruct malchut, a necessary stage in the process of Redemption. For this reason, the names of the maidservants appear before those of the Matriarchs.

Making a Grown Man Cry

When Yaakov first saw Rachel, he bawled like a baby. That's right! And with good reason.

A few good reasons to be exact:

1. When Yaakov laid eyes on Rachel, he knew she was destined to be his wife, so he kissed her. The shepherds that gathered at the well grumbled about the immorality of this stranger kissing one of their women. They didn't realize that Yaakov and Rachel were cousins. Yaakov was saddened that he was judged to have committed an immoral act.

Yaakov immediately knew that though Rachel was destined to be his wife, she would die at a young age and they wouldn't be buried together.

2. When Eliezer had come to Charan seeking a wife for Yitzchok, he brought camels loaded to the hilt with lots of precious jewels and gifts for the Machatanim (in-laws). But Yaakov was about to face Lavan empty-handed.

Here's why:

Originally, Yaakov started off with plenty of money, jewels and gifts. But moments after Yaakov cleared the Brachot from Yitzchok, he zoomed off towards Charan before Esav could catch him. Esav ordered his son, Elifaz, to catch Yaakov and kill him. Elifaz did eventually track down Yaakov.

Now Elifaz had a dilemma. Even though he was Esav's son, he had grown up in Yitzchok's house and learned "some" decent things from his grandfather. He knew it was wrong to kill Yaakov. But he also wanted to do the Mitzvah of Kibud Av (honoring one's father) and carry out Esav's orders.

Yaakov came up with a creative solution. According to the Torah, a poor man is equivalent to a dead man. Therefore, Yaakov told Elifaz to take all his possessions and Elifaz would be able to go back and tell his father that Yaakov is dead.

Now, Yaakov would have to face the diabolical Lavan with no gifts, jewels or cash and ask for Rachel's hand in marriage. (That's enough to make any grown man cry!)
