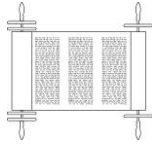

The Jersey Shore Torah Bulletin

“And [the Manna] tasted like honey” (Shemot 16:31)

The Rabbis tell us that the Manna tasted like whatever a person wanted it to taste like. If he thought about meat, it had a meat taste; if he had dairy in mind, it had a dairy taste. Rabbi Shimon Schwab z”l once visited the Hafess Hayim in 1930 and heard him ask the following question: “What if a person had nothing in mind when he ate the Manna? What would it taste like?” The Hafess Hayim answered, “If a person had nothing in mind, then the Manna would taste like nothing.” He went on to explain that the Manna is symbolic of everything spiritual; whatever we put into spiritual things determines what the taste of the outcome will be. If a person learns Torah or does misvot with enthusiasm, then his enjoyment and fulfillment will be apparent. However, if a person does it as if it is a chore, with no feeling, then it will be dull and tasteless. Just as we plan a vacation or something exciting with feeling and enthusiasm, so too we should approach our spiritual involvement. Then we will have a sweet taste in everything we do. Shabbat Shalom.

Know Your Shul Members — The Bermans

Originally from Chicago and St. Louis, respectively, Rabbi Dovid Yosef and Ruth Berman were in Baltimore visiting Ruth’s sister and her family twelve years ago when Rabbi Berman was offered a teaching position at Ner Israel. The young couple left Chicago for Baltimore with their baby, Aryeh; the family has since grown to include Rafi, 9, Shlomo, 8, Adina, 3½, and Akiva, 20 months, in addition to Aryeh, now 13.

Aside from the benefits of raising the kids near their cousins, Ruth appreciates that Baltimore offers many more organizations than either St. Louis or Chicago to help families with children with special needs. Menucha, Jewish Caring Network, Yachad,

and Chai Lifeline have all offered support in caring for Aryeh, who was born with a severe developmental disorder.

The Bermans found themselves led to Tiferes Yisroel by their sons Rafi and Shlomo, who are fans of the playground and the Friday night davening. Ruth is not often seen at shul, although she appreciates the singing and the camaraderie, as well as the presence of lots of children and the fact that the shul is handicapped-accessible. Rabbi Berman, Rafi, and Shlomo are regulars; Rafi especially loves the singing and the dancing on Friday nights, and he enjoys listening to Rabbi Goldberger’s music CD in morning carpool with the Rauns.

Rabbi Berman has smicha from Hebrew Theological College (aka Skokie Yeshiva) and currently teaches math, chemistry, environmental science, and Halacha and Gemara at four schools: Lev Shlomo, Ahavas Torah, Toras Chaim (Rabbi Szendro’s Yeshiva), and Ner Israel. He loves the intellectual side of Judaism — its “constant depth” — and finds many ways to bring Torah into his teaching of science.

For example: “Since we’re getting ready for Pesach, there’s a term in chemistry, a mole. (Its a standard unit, 6.022×10^{23} particles, also known as Avogadro’s number). A mole of water is 18 g. A mole of salt is 58 g. Thus, a mole of salt water is 76 g. And 76 is the gematria of eved (slave): another reason why we have salt water on Pesach.

Another example: “The Torah says you should not eat ‘dam, ki hu hanefesh’ (blood, because it is the soul). Anybody who’s taken CPR knows that you breathe into the person, and what you’re breathing into the person is carbon dioxide, because carbon dioxide in the blood is what causes the person to breathe. The mass of 1 mole of carbon dioxide is 44 g. The numerical value of dam is 44. There are connections to everything.”

Ruth loves the yomim tovim, the way each yom tov has its own quality — menorahs in the windows on Chanukah, the family aspect of Pesach. For Sukkos she made edible lulavim and esrogim for the kids. The lulavim were celery with grapes and apples on toothpicks, tied together with thin Twizzler strands, and hard-boiled eggs were the esrogim. She also made a cake in the shape of a sukkah.

Ruth laughs at the notion of a hobby. She likes to read and to bake — when she has time. Being a stay-at-home mother is her main occupation.

“I’m amazed at people who have time for hobbies. My husband’s hobbies are reading science fiction and drinking diet soda. Even going to a shiur is such an opportunity for me. There are some nights my husband comes home at seven or eight, and the kids need his attention so much. He learns mishnayos with Aryeh every night. That would be our hobbies.”
