What is The PJ Library?

The PJ Library is a wonderful new program for Jewish families with young children. Each month, every child enrolled in the program receives a **free**, age-appropriate, Jewish content book or CD, along with a short parent resource guide.

Who can join The PJ Library?

Children, ages 6 months to 5 ½ years of age, who live in the MetroWest area or who are members of a MetroWest constituent organization, are eligible to enroll on a first-come, first-served basis. We enrolled 1,400 children in 2008-2009 and we want to double that number in 2009-2010. There is no limit to the number of children enrolling per family. Friends or family may enroll a child from out of MetroWest for \$60 per child per year.

The PJ Library is also available to children with special needs who are older than 5½. Please e-mail or phone The PJ Library™ Coordinator directly to enroll your child.
