## What is Central RED Society?

State Public Defender Adam Gregg '06 will give a presentation about the new Wrongful Conviction Division in the Office of the State Public Defender. He will discuss the work of the Wrongful Conviction Division, the nature and causes of wrongful convictions and possible reforms to prevent wrongful convictions from occurring.

Adam Gregg was appointed by Governor Terry E. Branstad to serve as the lowa State public defender on Dec. 8, 2014. He was the Republican nominee for attorney general in 2014. Adam previously served as the Governor's legislative liaison and policy advisor. Prior to joining the Governor's Office, Adam practiced at the BrownWinick law firm in Des Moines. He is a graduate of Central College and Drake University Law School. He is married with two children.

We will begin our day with a guided tour of three of the six covered bridges. After the tour, we will enjoy lunch with beef noodles and apple crisp at the Northside Café. The Café was used in the movie and is well known for American home cooking served up in an old-fashioned establishment. After lunch, we will have two hours to visit at our own pace: The John Wayne Museum (recently honored with an Outstanding Attraction Award from the lowa Tourism Office); the lowa Quilt Museum, which will feature "The Bounty of Baskets" (small basket quilts); and the many quaint shops around the square. On Oct. 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted 95 objections to the Church's sale of indulgences – declarations that punishment for particular sins had been remitted. Near-legendary accounts of this act and its aftermath abound. This talk attempts to show that the actual historical record is indeed more interesting than fiction.

# Loren & Linda Blom: Did Someone Say "Beer"?

An Introduction to Home Brewing: How to make beer at home with minimum equipment. This is a quick overview of the brewing process for amateur oenologists and equipment required to make your first batch. Beer Tasting 101: We will review the characteristics of six different beer styles and sample a commercial example of each style. Where possible, we use beers produced by lowa craft breweries. Larger samples will be available for purchase after the class.

Loren and Linda Blom have been making their own beer and mead for twenty years. They began after being exposed to ales for the first time in 1997 during a trip to England. They have won a number of awards from lowa competitions including the lowa State Fair. In 2011, they began studying for the Beer Judge Certification Program (BJCP) tests and in September 2012 were awarded the rank of Recognized Beer Judge. Today they are two of approximately 5,000 active BJCP beer judges in the world.
