



# BEGINNER ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSE

In order to receive the Imperial English UK certificate for the level you study at you need to complete a minimum of 80% of the course and achieve a minimum 50% pass mark for the tasks.

## Certification:

On successful completion of the course, a Certification of Completion will be awarded by Imperial English UK. The certificate includes information about the student, course dates, CEFR level, certificate number and issue date.

## Authenticity:

The authenticity of the awarded certification can be checked on the Imperial English UK website.

## General English Course : 60 hours

### Aims

The aims of the course are:

- To provide you with a basic level of English and English language skills using advanced and interactive learning apps.
- To motivate you by studying topics that encourage students to learn English in a systematic and enjoyable way.
- To build and develop a basic level of English so you can progress onto more communicative and career-oriented courses.
- To develop the skills of learner independence, communication, collaboration and creativity.
- To encourage and support you to use your English in daily life and help your future studies and work.
- To develop digital learning skills both in the classroom and through self-study.
- To provide an additional, useful qualification.

### Learning Outcomes

During this course you will:

- Develop across all four key skills; reading, writing, speaking and listening.
- Develop and use knowledge of English grammar and pronunciation.
- Learn how to use new vocabulary in a range of everyday topics.
- Track your learning using the digital learning app. This will help you stay focused and motivated both in class and at home.
- Understand what you need to do next to improve your level of English and achieve your targets.

After this course you can:

- Feel more confident in communicating in English both in the classroom and independently.
- Exchange information with other people in conversation.
- Communicate information and requests in writing
- Read different types of informative texts and answer questions about them.
- Feel more confident to listen to and understand native English speakers when listening.
- Be confident in assessing your progress and needs.

### Content

The course has of 30 topics that are relevant, interesting and useful to learners.

There is a topic-based integrated skills approach course to help students use the language they meet for communication and to practise basic grammar patterns for accuracy.

Each topic has specific aims and has a variety of tasks to improve the student's English in each of the four skills (reading, writing, listening, speaking) in a relevant and enjoyable way.

There is also extra grammar practice and students can study and review on the app before and after classes.

## Form & Functional Skills : 15 hours

### Aims

The Functions and Skills Course runs alongside the General English course and has extra practice in the essential skills of literacy, sound discrimination, pronunciation and functional language to communicate and understand in daily life in English.

The aims of the course are:

- To help you learn English through English
- To develop learner independence.
- To help you understand and use of English language pronunciation features.
- To give you reading and spelling practice.
- To help you increase your vocabulary
- To help you write with a clear purpose.
- To help you use functional language for a specific situational purpose.
- To help you progress to an A2 level of English language use.

### Learning Outcomes

During the course you will:

- Learn to make requests, express opinions, and socialise using appropriate functional language.
- Use vocabulary for practical everyday situations.
- Write invitations, messages, complete forms and express preferences.
- Write using correct spelling and punctuation.
- Become familiar with the sounds and features of connected speech, including word stress, sentence stress and intonation.
- Use numbers to tell the time, give dates, give telephone numbers and buy in shops.
- Read short descriptive texts.

### Content

Topics are the same as in the General English Series but the skills and language in the lessons are for practical situations outside the classroom as well as provide extra practice for the General English Series course content.
