Penn State chapter of Delta Sigma Phi charged with furnishing alcohol to minors

It is not the first fraternity charged this semester. Last month, Lambda Chi Alpha was charged with serving minors after a visibly intoxicated 18-year-old woman was found by police sitting outside the fraternity. She and two other underage women reported having been served beer and vodka at the fraternity in November 2013. Lambda Chi Alpha waived a preliminary hearing on those charges Oct. 3.

Text

Oct. 21--A Penn State fraternity has been charged with giving alcohol to minors.

On Friday, State College police filed charges against Delta Sigma Phi, listed on the Interfraternity Council website as "one of the oldest fraternities at Penn State" and one of the largest Greek organizations on campus.

The chapter is being cited with two misdemeanor counts of selling or furnishing liquor to minors and two counts of furnishing liquor, malt or brewed beverages to certain persons.

All four counts date to an Aug. 26 incident. A preliminary hearing is scheduled for Nov. 19.

Delta Sigma Phi was charged with serving minors in April 2010. The chapter pleaded guilty, paid a \$500 fine and served 27 days of community service.

It is not the first fraternity charged this semester.

Last month, Lambda Chi Alpha was charged with serving minors after a visibly intoxicated 18-year-old woman was found by police sitting outside the fraternity. She and two other underage women reported having been served beer and vodka at the fraternity in November 2013.

Lambda Chi Alpha waived a preliminary hearing on those charges Oct. 3. Formal arraignment is scheduled for Oct. 29.

Both organizations face potential reprimands from the IFC, in addition to their legal troubles.

"The IFC will take action against these chapters if they are found responsible for violating federal law, Pennsylvania law, university policy or IFC bylaws," IFC President Dan Combs said. "We are in the process of conducting an investigation to determine if the chapters are responsible for violating any of these policies or laws."

ISU fraternity could face sanctions in barn dance event

Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity is under investigation by the office of Community Rights and Responsibilities at ISU for holding an event that was not registered with the university, said ISU spokesman Jay Groves. Sororities and fraternities are required to register any events where alcohol may be served.

Text

Oct. 26--NORMAL -- An Illinois State University fraternity faces possible sanctions for its role in organizing a barn dance in rural Mackinaw for 160 students, including 13 who were arrested for underage drinking on the way to the event.

Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity is under investigation by the office of Community Rights and Responsibilities at ISU for holding an event that was not registered with the university, said ISU spokesman Jay Groves.

Sororities and fraternities are required to register any events where alcohol may be served. Pi Kappa Alpha had been told not to host events because an investigation was pending into similar complaints involving its parties, said Groves.

The Greek organization came under scrutiny after McLean County sheriff's deputies responded to an accident at 7:40 p.m. Saturday at 1200 East and 1800 North roads, northwest of Normal. The driver of a van owned by Bloomington-Normal Enterprises missed a stop sign and drove into a cornfield, according to police reports.

Deputies checked identifications and 13 passengers, including one juvenile, were arrested for underage drinking. Eleven were identified as ISU students and a 17-year-old was a Unit 5 student. The students admitted to officers that they had been drinking before they left campus.

Anna Crowell, the driver of the 15-passenger van, was cited for disobeying a traffic control device, failure to reduce speed to avoid an accident and violation of license classification.

On Friday, the city issued a notice to Crowell that her permit as a vehicle-for-hire driver has been revoked, effective Oct. 31, based on the traffic citations, said Nora Dukowitz, communications manager for the city.

Crowell told deputies that she was taking the students to a barn dance in Tazewell County and that information was passed on to the Tazewell County Sheriff's Department.

At 1 a.m., Tazewell County Deputy Kyle Klein went to 32971 Morgan Road, where 160 people were boarding buses to return back to ISU, according to the officer's report.

Larry Morgan, the owner of the property who was interviewed by Klein, denied Thursday that any event was held on his property.

"I don't know where you got that" information, Morgan told The Pantagraph. He did not respond to questions about his name and address being in the police report.

Morgan denied to police that alcohol was served at the event but "he stated he got paid a good wage to host the 'Barn Party,'" said the report.

Police did not check to see if alcohol was present on the property or if the partygoers were underage. Klein took the word of Morgan and people identified as security staff that no alcohol was served, according to the report.

Tazewell County Sheriff's Capt. Tim Gillespie acknowledged Friday that Morgan's claim that 200 college students "just came to hang out in his barn" described an unlikely outing for the group.

"Obviously, there's something more to it," said Gillespie.

The deputy had other calls pending and was satisfied that the students were leaving the property, said Gillespie.

Cameron Matus, the fraternity member identified in police reports as an organizer of the event, could not be reached for comment.

The students were agitated and reluctant to talk, according to the police report, because the three-hour event was extended by two hours after a dispute erupted with Bloomington-Normal Limousine over a broken a window in one of the transport vehicles, said Klein's report.

When police arrived, three buses from Magic Bus Shuttles in Bloomington were loading the students. Magic Bus owner Lee Eutsey said he received a call from the fraternity and agreed to transport the students for \$4 each.

Eutsey said he has been contacted by ISU in reference to the unregistered party. He said the students returned to campus without further incident.

NORTHRIDGE, Calif. (AP) — Cal State University, Northridge, has temporarily banned its 54 fraternities and sororities from recruitment and pledging activities for new members as it investigates another possible hazing incident.

The Los Angeles Times reported (<http://lat.ms/1nHlssC>) Sunday that the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity is under investigation after a complaint from a pledge who expressed concerns a week ago about activities.

Campus spokeswoman Carmen Ramos Chandler said no one was reported injured but wouldn't release details because of the pending investigation. The ban is expected to last until the spring and "until the fraternities can demonstrate they understand what a zero-tolerance policy is on hazing," Chandler said.

A CSUN student died July 1 during a rigorous Pi Kappa Phi fraternity hike in hot weather in the Angeles National Forest.

School administrators concluded it was a hazing incident, and the fraternity's CSUN chapter was shut down.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is conducting a criminal investigation into the death of 19-year-old Armando Villa.

Meanwhile, the Zeta Omicron chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha at Cal State Northridge has been placed on interim suspension pending the outcome of the university's investigation.

"It is shocking and disappointing that this conduct persists after all the efforts undertaken by so many this fall to ensure a recruitment-and-intake process that conforms to the university's zero-tolerance policy on hazing," William Watkins, the campus vice president for student affairs and dean of students, said in a statement.

Leaders of the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity and officials at its national headquarters couldn't be reached for comment Friday.

Campus leaders said that the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity was under investigation for possible hazing, nearly four months after a pledge at a different Greek organization died during a mandatory hike.

Oct. 25--As Cal State Northridge investigates another possible hazing incident, the school has banned its 54 fraternities and sororities from all recruitment and pledging activities for new members possibly until the spring, officials said.

Campus leaders said that the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity was under investigation for possible hazing, nearly four months after a pledge at a different Greek organization died during a mandatory hike.

The latest probe came in response to a complaint from "a very courageous pledge" who expressed concern a week ago about activities at the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity, according to campus spokeswoman Carmen Ramos Chandler. She said that no one was reported injured in the activity, but she declined to release details because of the investigation.

The 25 fraternities, 28 sororities and one coed fraternity will be allowed to induct new members but must suspend all pledge activity until the ban is lifted, she said. That is expected to last the rest of the fall semester and possibly into the spring "until the fraternities can demonstrate they understand what a zero tolerance policy is on hazing," she said.

The campus is particularly vigilant about hazing since the July 1 death of CSUN student Armando Villa, 19, during a rigorous fraternity hike during very hot weather in Angeles National Forest. School administrators concluded that was a fatal hazing incident and Pi Kappa Phi fraternity voted to shut down the CSUN chapter after Villa's death.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is expected to soon conclude a criminal investigation into the death.

In the more recent incident, the Zeta Omicron chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha was placed on interim suspension at Cal State Northridge pending the outcome of the university's investigation. Its national organization placed it on administrative suspension, campus leaders said.

"It is shocking and disappointing that this conduct persists after all the efforts undertaken by so many this fall to ensure a recruitment and intake process that conforms to the university's zero-tolerance policy on hazing," William Watkins, the campus vice president for student affairs and dean of students, said in a statement.

Leaders of the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity and the campus' pan-Hellenic Council could not be reached for comment Friday. Officials at the fraternity's national headquarters in Memphis, Tenn., also were not reached.

On the Facebook page of the Pi Kappa Alpha chapter at Northridge, a recent posting announced that the fraternity is supporting National Hazing Prevention Week and joined with other fraternities to "address important issues of sexual misconduct, hazing and binge drinking head on."

The Sundial, the Cal State Northridge student newspaper, reported that Villa's family welcomed the halt on pledge activities.

Douglas Aberle, attorney for the dead student's family, told the paper that "we are pleased that the university is finally taking an active role in addressing and controlling the behavior of those under its supervision. Unfortunately it has come too late for Armando. We hope universities across the country will pay close attention to what has gone on and take similar action."

However, some Greek system members told the Sundial that they thought it was unfair that all fraternities and sororities were being punished for the violations of a few.
