

## Viva Aerobus provides information concerning flight 2307 from Merida – Guadalajara

Mexico City, May 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2018.– Regarding the recently published case regarding one of Viva Aerobus' flights covering the Merida – Guadalajara route, the Company informs:

- On May 2<sup>nd</sup> of 2018, around 19:30 hours, one of our aircraft, covering the Merida Guadalajara route, flight 2307, had to return to Merida International Airport (MID) due to the activation of the landing gear warning system.
- The Captain landed safely without further incidents being reported and all passengers and crew members safe and sound. Viva Aerobus will provide food, flight changes, lodging or reimbursements of 125% for all passengers, according to the Mexican Civil Aviation Law.
- The aircraft will be overhauled by our maintenance team and the Mexican aviation authorities before returning to service.
- For Viva Aerobus, the safety in its operations and its passengers is the top priority.
