Mexico City, Mexico, May 13, 2016 - Maxcom Telecomunicaciones, S.A.B. de C.V. (OTCQX: MXMTY, BMV: MAXCOM.CPO) ("Maxcom" or the "Company") announced today that, following up on the relevant event published on August 10, 2015; from April 01, 2018, Maxcom will no longer provide point to multipoint microwave links in Regions 3, 5 and 8 of the Mexican territory.

It is important to mention that Maxcom had no revenues from the operation of this service during 2015.

It should be noted that the other concessions granted to the Company are in place and operating and, therefore, there is no effect on the delivery of services to our customers nor on the Company's revenues.
