- 4. Unless otherwise specified, the domain of any function f is assumed to be the set of all real numbers x for which f(x) is a real number.








Special Right Triangles

- No question has a negative answer.


 Mixed numbers such as $4\frac{1}{2}$ must be gridded as 4.5 or 9/2. (If 411 if 12 is gridded, it will be interpreted as $\frac{41}{2}$, not $4\frac{1}{2}$.)

• <u>Decimal Answers:</u> If you obtain a decimal answer with more digits than the grid can accommodate, it may be either rounded or truncated, but it must fill the entire grid. For example, if you obtain an answer such as 0.6666...., you should record your result as .666 or .667. A less accurate value such as .66 or .67 will be scored as incorrect.










^{11.} In the figure above, NR and MQ intersect at point O. What is the value of $\angle POQ$ if y = 150 and ON bisects $\angle MOP$?




13. Given the following circles, both with center at point *O*, what is the probability of randomly selecting a point in the shaded area?




12. Given $\triangle ABC$ and \overline{AB} is parallel to \overline{CD} , if x = 35 and y = 125, what is the value of z?
