Monthly plan premium for people who get extra help from Medicare to help pay for their Prescription Drug costs

If you get extra help from Medicare to help pay for your Medicare prescription drug plan costs, your monthly plan premium may be lower than what it would be if you did not get extra help from Medicare.

If you get extra help, your monthly plan premium will be \$0 for any of the plan(s) below. (This does not include any Medicare Part B premium you may have to pay.)

- IU Health Plans Medicare Select Plus (HMO) 002
- IU Health Plans Medicare Select Plus (HMO) 003
- IU Health Plans Medicare \$0 Preferred (HMO)
- IU Health Plans Medicare Flex Network (HMO-POS)
- IU Health Plans Medicare Kidney Care (HMO)

IU Health Plans' premium includes coverage for both medical services and prescription drug coverage.

If you aren't getting extra help, you can see if you qualify by calling:
