We Must Obey Our Elders



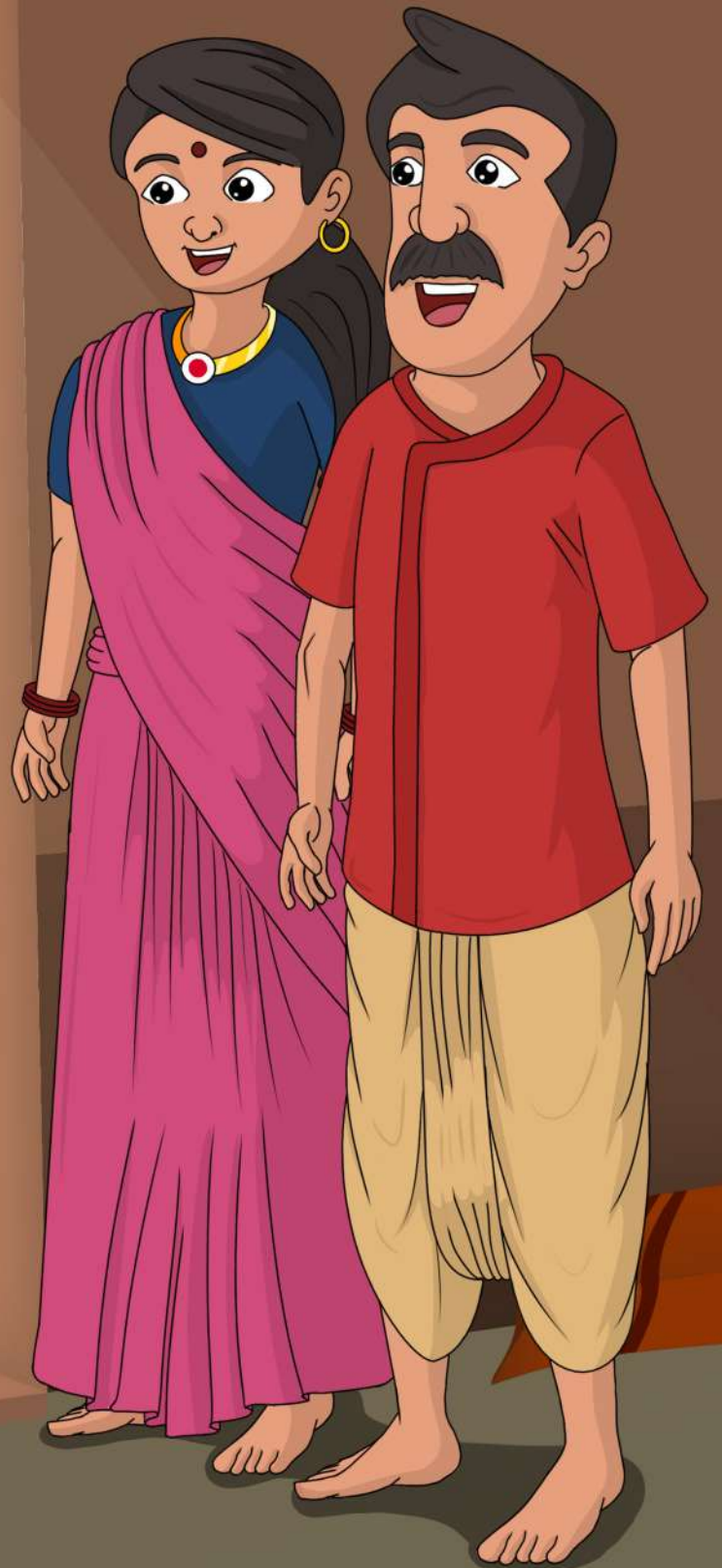
We must listen to our

I must listen to them.



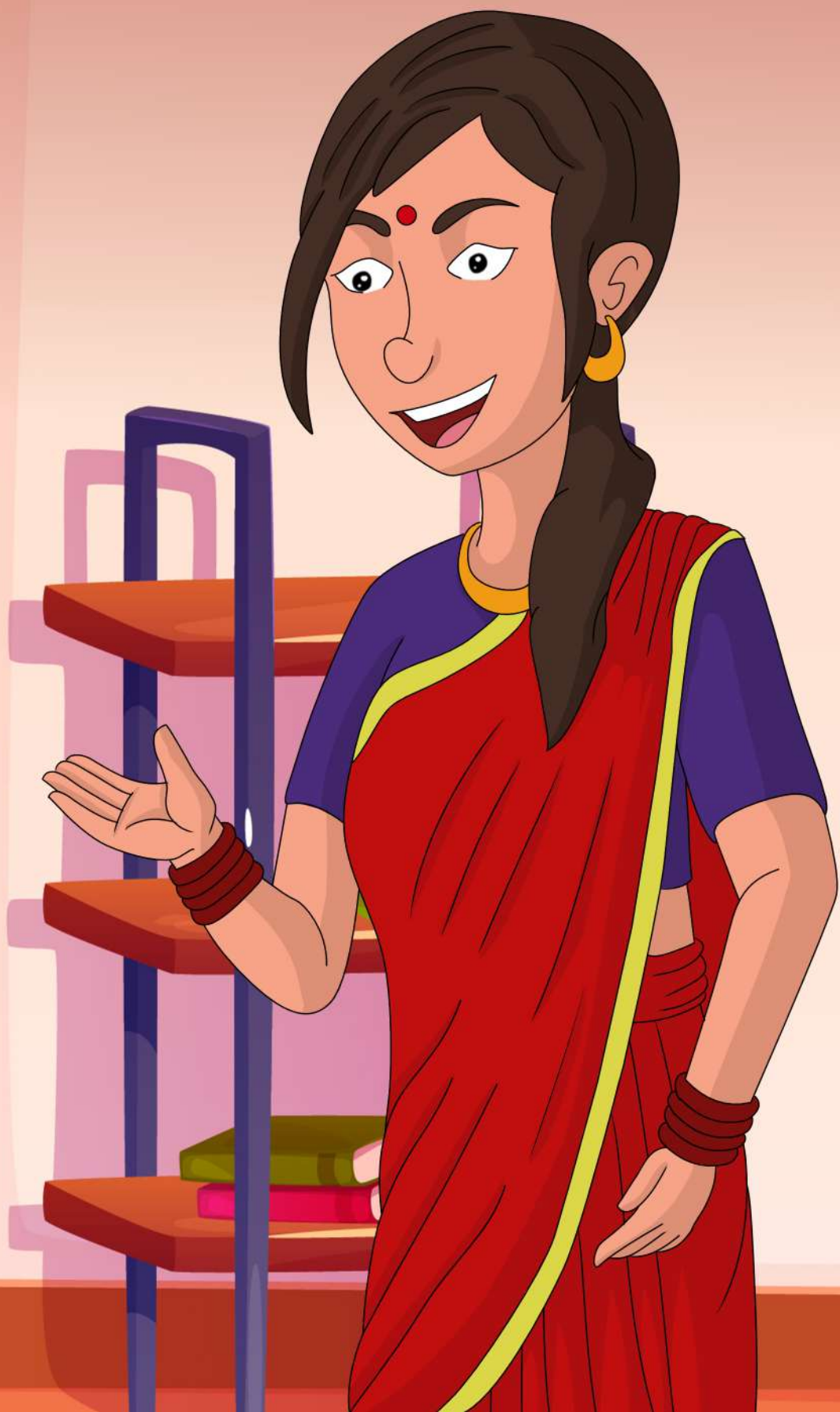
I must obey them.

"Stay at home".



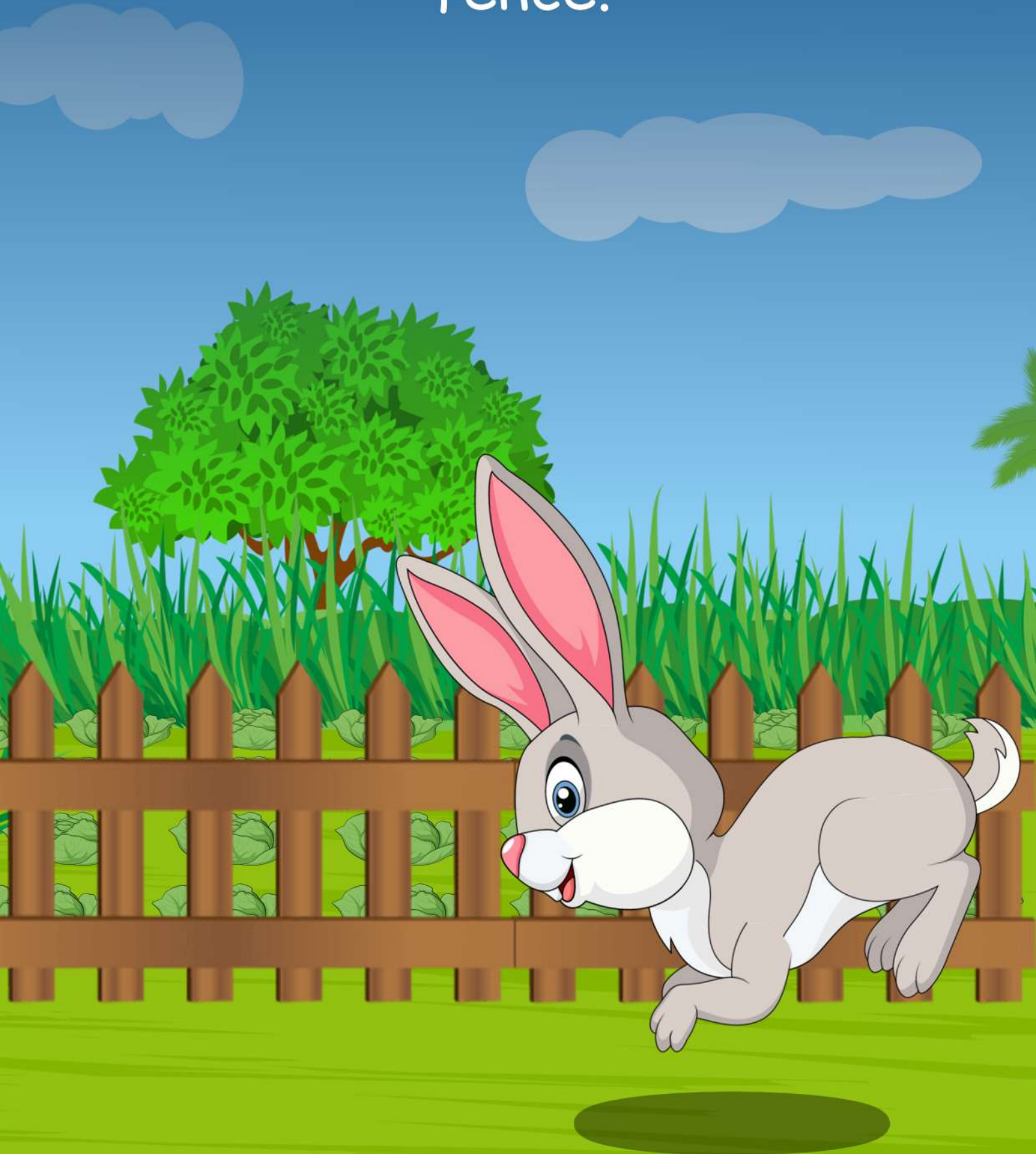
"It is not safe outside.

you".



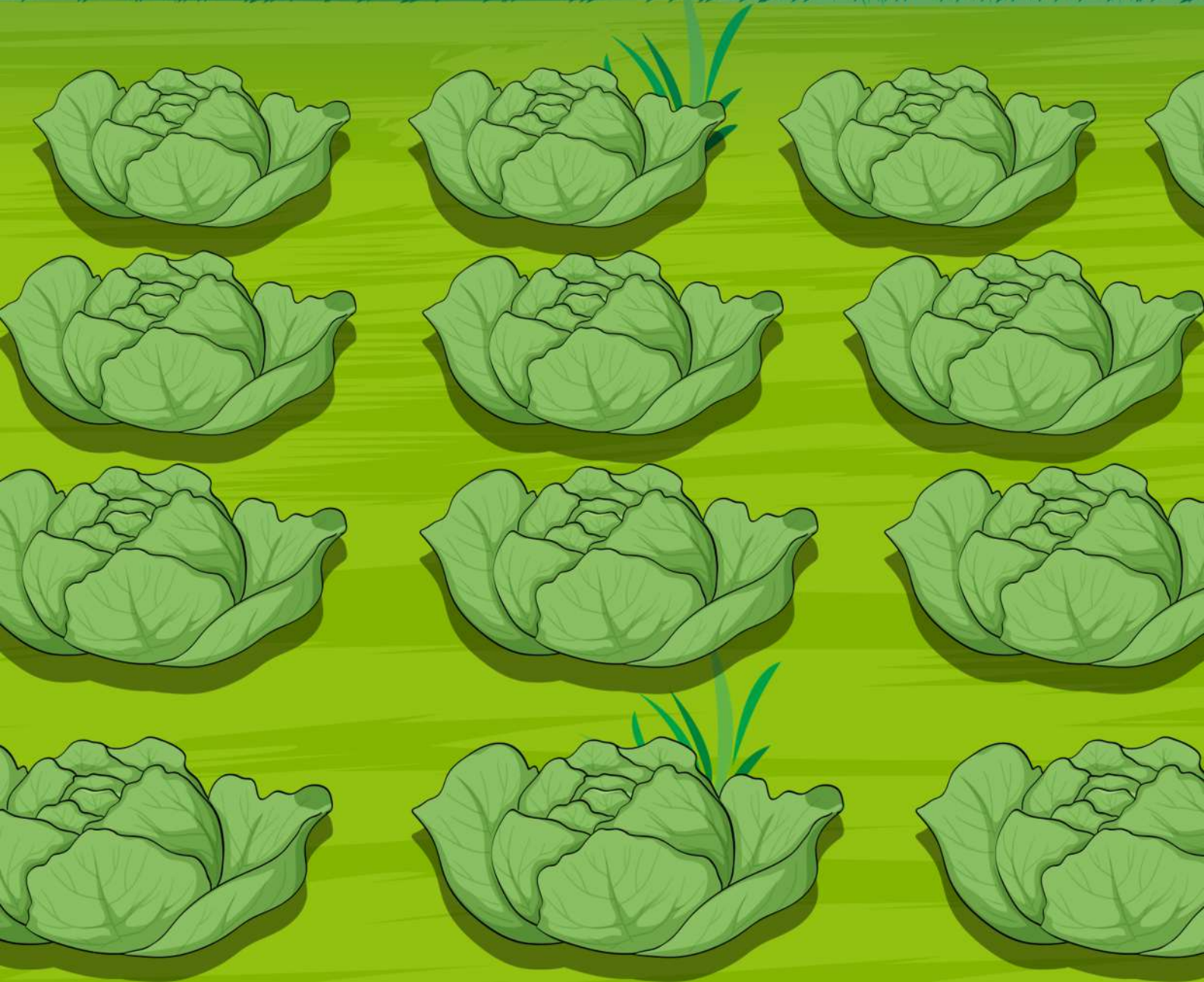
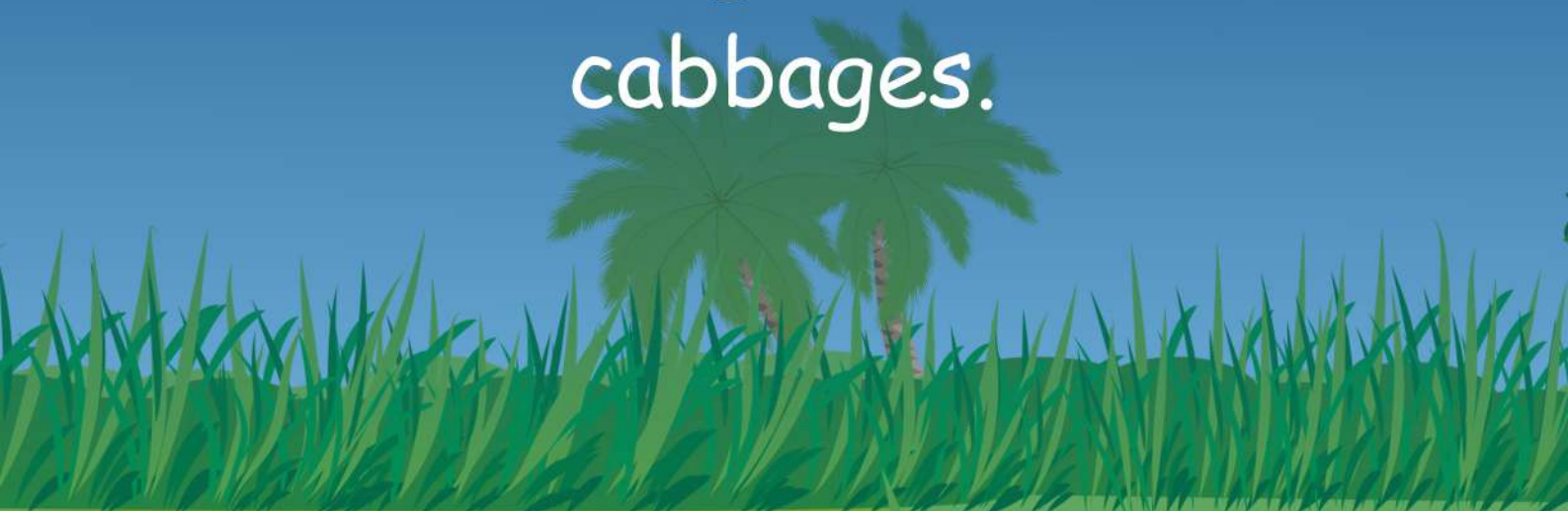
The little girls stayed at home, but Dolu, the naughty rabbit, went outside.

fence.



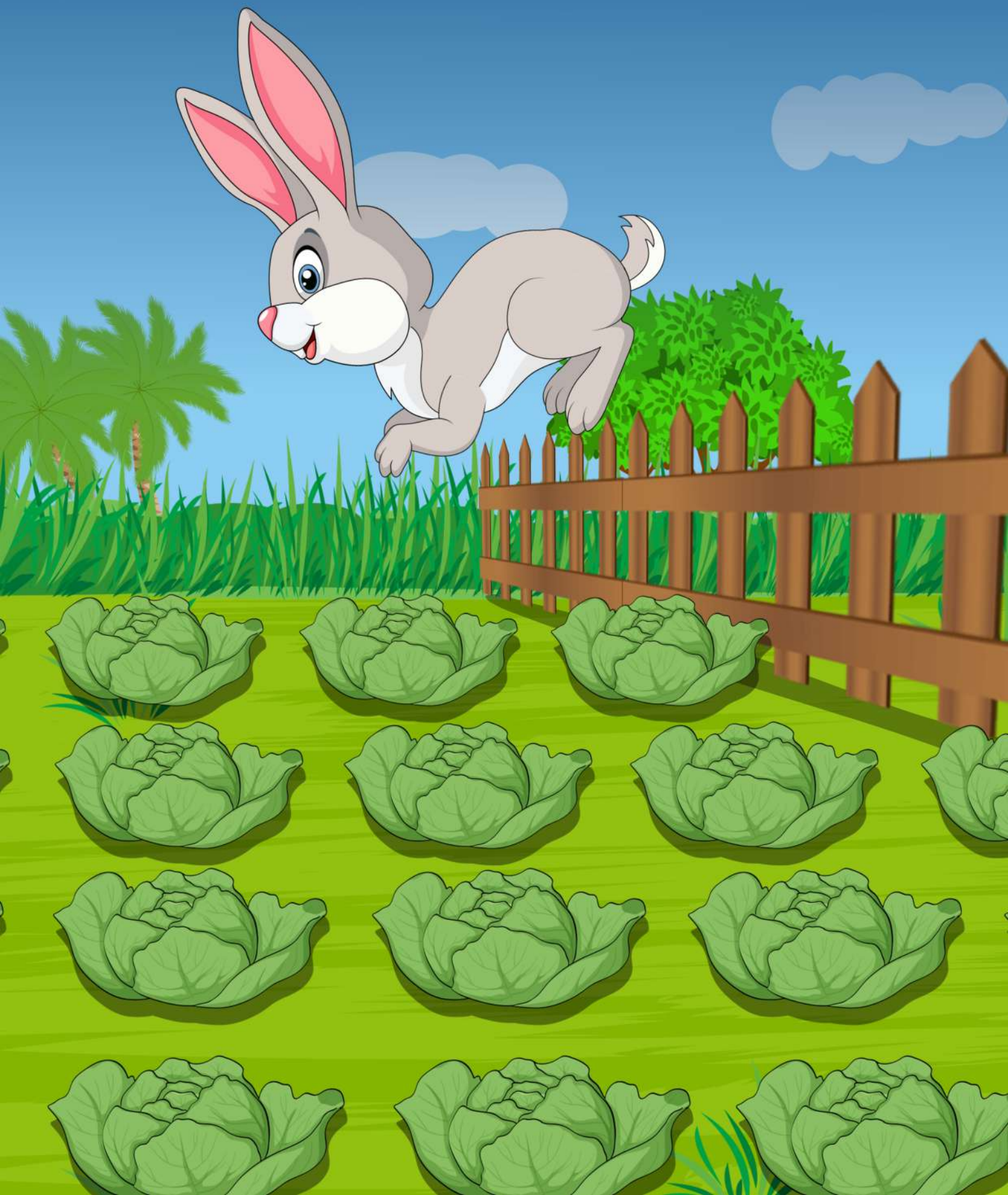
Inside the fence he saw

Dolu hopped over the fence.



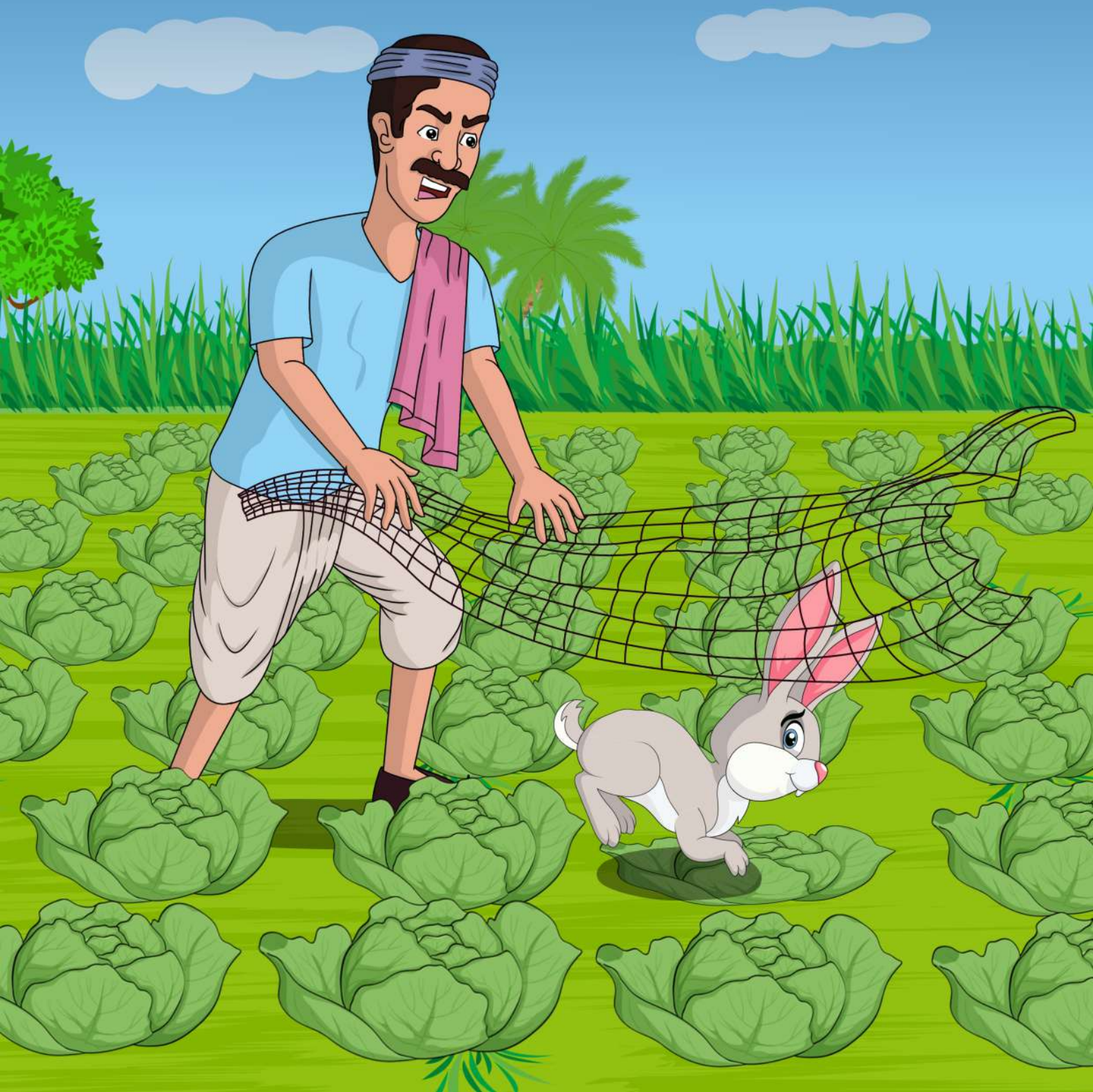
Just then, the farmer saw

after him.



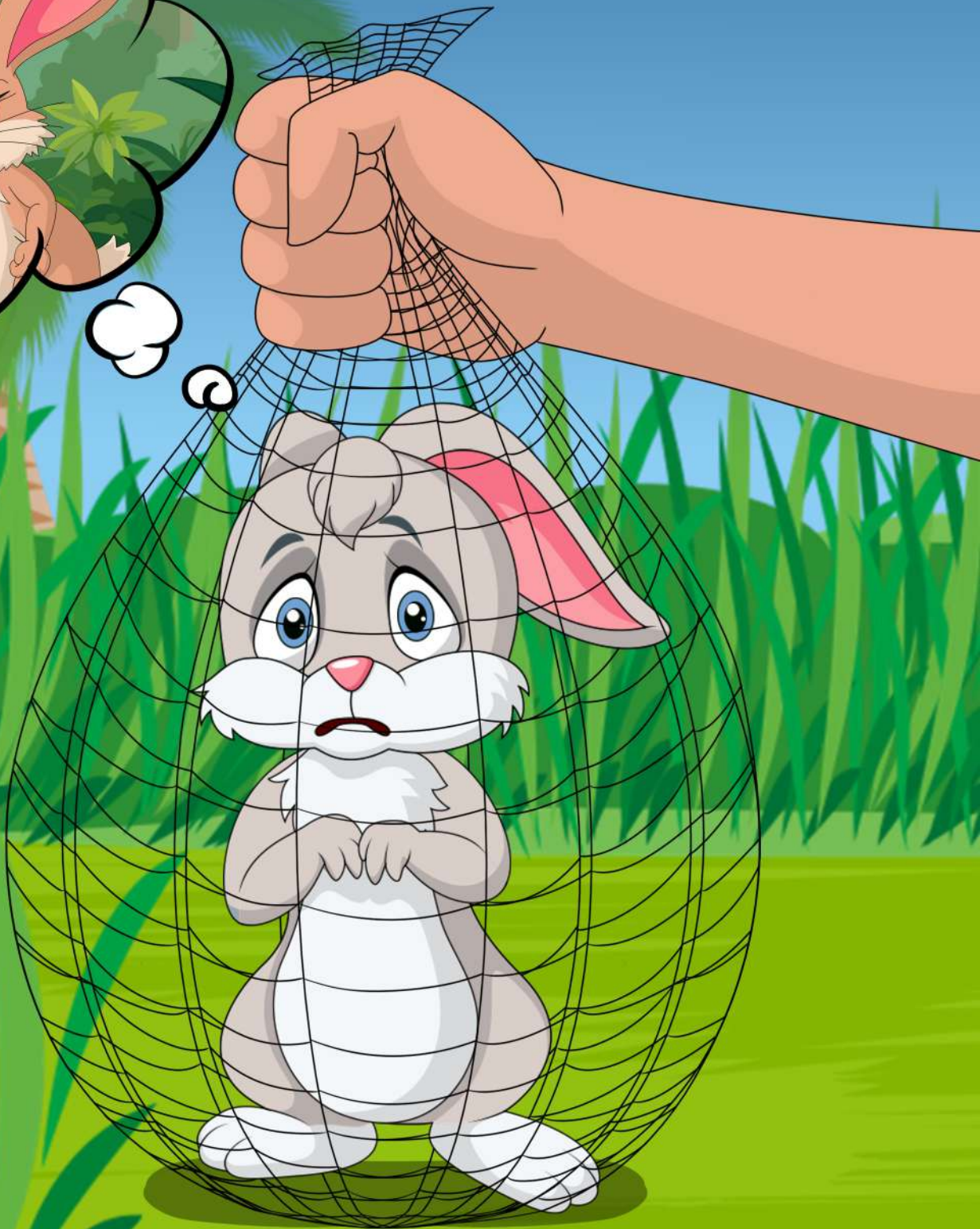
Fast hopped the rabbit and

Then the farmer threw a net on Dolu and caught him.



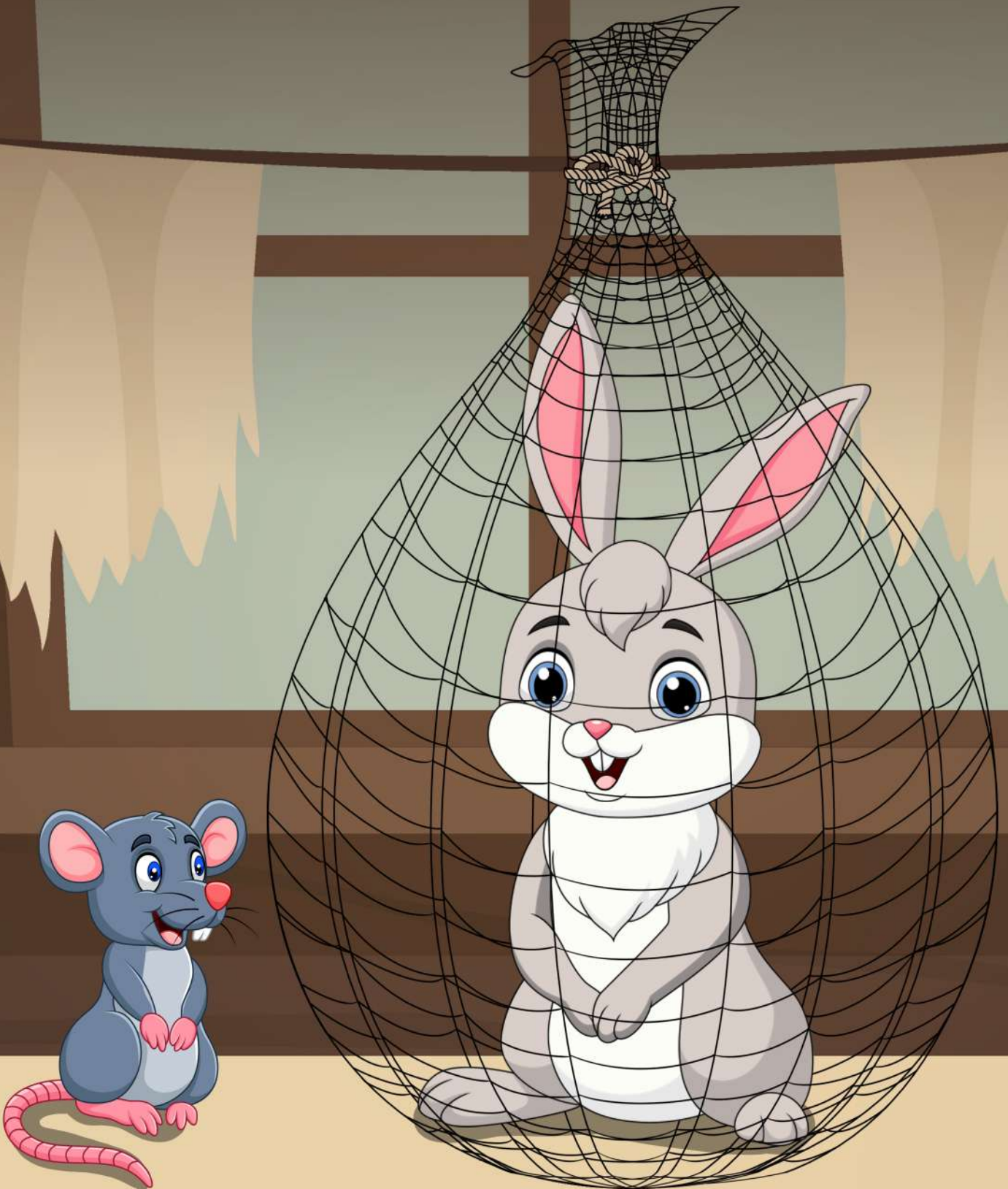
Poor Dolu! He wished he had listened to his mother.
