

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments-Digital Behavior: Parents create trust with children by initiating open, honest discussions. These dialogues are an opportunity to communicate values and expectations about your family's

appropriate digital behavior, including viewing or sharing content, and apps they can and cannot use. Check in frequently with your children about their digital experiences to address any potential risk of

cyberbullying and harm. Be clear that your intention is to look out for their wellbeing, and that you want to have an open dialogue. Listen to their concerns

and express your perspective. To minimize the risk of cyberbullying or harm from digital behavior, parents can: set clear expectations about digital

behavior and online reputation, educate about the harmful effects of cyberbullying, posting hateful

speech or comments, sexting, and sharing naked photos of themselves or others (including potential

legal issues), be clear about what content can be viewed or shared, and identify which apps are appropriate for your child's use and which are not.

Establish rules about the amount of time that a child can spend online or on their devices. Model positive,

respectful digital behavior on your own devices and accounts. For more information on

#### FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

November 7, 2021 32th Sunday in Ordinary Time

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

Amen Prayer App: The Augustine Institute, the same folks who provide us with the excellent content of FORMED, have developed a new app to help Catholics deepen our life of prayer. It's called, simply – Amen. I downloaded it onto my iPhone, and I am really impressed. Looking at the app right now as I write, I see not only the daily Mass readings (which are read aloud), but scriptural meditations on such topics as "courage" and "anxiety," the mysteries of the rosary in audio form, and even nighttime reflections. The Amen app may be something you want to check out!

Vigil Project Advent Presence: If you have not done so yet, please draw a big circle around December 6 on your family calendar. That day is the feast of St. Nicholas, and although we won't be placing the traditional candy in your shoes (Fr. Nicholas Rouch used to do that for the guys when I lived at the seminary), we will be giving you a beautiful evening of adoration, witness, and music. I am so excited for this "Advent Presence" experience. The Vigil Project's music is wonderful (we provided a Christmas CD from them two years ago), and the thought of bringing the parish together in front of the Blessed Sacrament for silent prayer really moves me. Please do what you must to be there. Families, please join us. Thank you so much!

**St. Anthony Collection:** Every once in a while we still get a check in the collection basket that is written out to "St. Anthony Church." Although we greatly appreciate the generosity of such gifts, the bank is not so grateful. In fact, they are telling us that they will no longer cash them. So if you would, please make sure your checks are written out to Holy Redeemer Parish. Remember, it's all one account. And along those lines, you are welcome to drop funds in the basket to support the Sheffield Food Pantry and the good work they do. Holy Hour for Vocations: Please join us Monday, November 8, 7:00-8:00 pm for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with the specific intent to pray for new vocations to the priesthood. Experience tells us that a day of retreat provides the Holy Spirit with a unique moment to work powerfully in the heart of a young person. Mass, confessions, prayer, good food, and fellowship will all be provided for these confirmandi. Please pray that they accept the Spirit's movement in their lives!



#### Inspiration for the week

"What God has joined together." We are all familiar with these words. Because man and woman are essentially of the same substance, although also distinctively different, there is an innate desire to be connected and united. Admittedly, marriage covenants can be extremely difficult to negotiate and, at times, very painful to experience. But they can also be celebrations of great union and happiness. This is proven by couples who have been married for many years who still have that same twinkle of devotion in their eyes that was present on their wedding day. God designed it to be this way. By God's power, the two become one. This is not of human design. The true intimacy of marriage is a Divine Intimacy. It is a bond created by a power far greater than any found in the two people who are joined. Marriage is where the virtue of love is most fully expressed.



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226) left a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land.

Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith.

Today, St. Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals are blessed on his feast day.
