





As the fall weather beckons us to wrap in warmer clothes, let's take the opportunities to enrich our lives with more good nourishment. Here are some good books I've recently come across:

In early September, I prepared and led the Holy Hour reflecting upon the life and teachings of Pope Gregory I (The Great). Subsequently, I read through many of his "greatest hits" (collection of writings) that were gathered into a book, **Be Friends of God** (1990), compiled and edited by John Leinenweber, a Benedictine monk. Time and again, it really pays to contact the original source — to ponder Gregory's words yourself — so to be enriched by these amazing thinkers and leaders. His reflections on the woman who anointed the feet of Jesus (whom he incorrectly identifies as Mary Magdalene) really grabbed me, as did his ruminations on the parable of the rich man and Lazarus, to name just two.

The title intrigued me – *Accidental Saints: Finding God in All the Wrong People* (2015). Nadia Bolz-Weber, a Lutheran pastor, composed this earthy, often irreverent series of vignettes that are certainly unorthodox but always compelling. She spouts vulgar language like a sailor, but she hits the bull's eye on identifying the most important issues of faith and calls for us all (including herself) to repent and re-think why we do what we do as disciples of Christ. Her chapter on Mary is amazing! (for not being Catholic!) Her observations on the Easter Exsultet and double-booking her schedule made me pause and make resolutions.

Carol Berry has authored a well-integrated reflection – *Learning from Henri Nouwen & Vincent van Gogh:* A *Portrait of the Compassionate Life* (2019). Her husband, a pastor, went for further studies at Yale and ended up in Fr Nouwen's classes. She decided to audit one course and between the lives and passions of Nouwen (who taught about the artist van Gogh) – and their own trials and struggles – Berry weaves together a book that contains the best of all four people (including prints of the painter's work), although there is not as much of Henri's life here as I would have wished. I've gotten to know this great and faith-filled author from his many books before; all of them worthwhile and many still in print. Happy reading!


