

## **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

## IESUS NAZARENUS REX IUDÆORUM

Often people ask the meaning of the initials "I.N.R.I.," which appear on the scroll at the top of a crucifix. When a criminal was crucified by the Roman authorities, the crime for which he was charged and convicted was posted over his head. Pontius Pilate had the crime for which Jesus was crucified written in Hebrew, Latin and Greek. (John 19:20) "I.N.R.I."

are the initials of the Latin words of this inscription, which you see above, meaning, "Jesus the Nazorean, King of the Jews." (John 19:19)

This weekend, the last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. In his trial before Pilate, Jesus insisted, "My kingdom does not belong to this world." (Today's Gospel) Yes, he is a king, but not like the kings of this world. His kingdom knows no boundaries. His throne is not a chair, but a cross. His crown is not made of gold or jewels, but of thorns. Yet all dominion is his (First Reading) because he has purchased us with his Precious Blood. He has defeated the powers of darkness by entering into the realm of death and rising victorious on the third day. He is truly the Alpha and Omega (Second Reading); the beginning and the end. From him we have our origin as children of God, and our destiny is also bound up with him. This is all summed up in our profession of faith: "I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ...through him all things were made...He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end."

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 when the world was experiencing a rise of secularism, materialism, individualism, and an increasing denial of Christ's existence and authority. The hope was that the establishment of this feast would accomplish three goals: those nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom; that leaders and governments would know that they are required to give respect to Christ, the King of kings; and that the faithful would be strengthened and encouraged by the reminder that Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills, and bodies.

This feast is needed more than ever for all people and for us, especially as Christian stewards. It reminds us of three vital truths. First, even when it seems the world is spinning out of control, we need not fear because we have a King of kings who is very much in charge and loving, merciful, and just. Second, if Christ is King of all, then he is also King of me, personally. I am not the "lord" of my time, talents, and treasure; he is. I am a servant of the King and a steward of his gifts to me. Third, as his disciple, I am called to imitate my King. Christ's kingship is characterized by humble service, by emptying himself for the good of others. The Scriptures tell us he went about doing good, and he says of himself, "I came not to be served but to serve." How can I live in any other way than as a humble servant like my King? Please keep this in mind when considering how to support your parish and the Diocesan Annual Appeal.

This Thursday we celebrate Thanksgiving Day. As American Catholics we have a unique act of thanksgiving to offer: the Mass. Why not include the Mass as part of your family's Thanksgiving Day tradition! Mass will be offered at St. Charles on Thanksgiving morning at 8:30.

Although this is a wonderful time of year, it has its hazards. Deer hunting can be dangerous for those who are not careful and the same is true of holiday driving. Please be careful and enjoy the coming week.

Pray the rosary again this week for the souls in purgatory. Pray for the safety of hunters and all traveling for the Thanksgiving holiday. Pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Pray for the return of those who no longer practice their faith and, as always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace. Monsignor Gorman
