

PASTORAL REFLECTION



A POWERLESS KING

Today we recognize Jesus' role as the Lord of all, the ruler over all humanity, the king of the eternal heavenly kingdom. Let us pray that when our day comes, we will be found worthy and ready for the kingdom.

When I hear the word 'KING' three images immediately comes to my mind. The first is the medieval king of a castle with all the subjects bowing before him. The second is "King Kong" the giant gorilla with an ugly face, crushing its next prey. The third is the so-called 'King of the Road', a big bus transit speeding on the highway with small cars behind it. These three images connote power, might and strength.

In contrast, our Gospel Reading shows a weak, powerless Jesus being summoned and interrogated by Pilate. When asked about his kingship, Jesus responds with these words: "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here." (Jn. 18:35) He told Pilate that, since He was behind enemy lines, He was alone; He had no one to defend Him. Jesus even added. "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." (Jn. 18:36) He explained to Pilate the purpose of His kingship: to testify to the truth about God.

When Jesus was before Pilate, was He really a powerless king? Or was there power in His powerlessness? What was His power? His power was truth. What truth did Jesus proclaim? It is the truth that He was the one sent by His Father to confront the world about the truth of their sinfulness and the truth that God can liberate them from sin and death through the sacrifice of His Son.

As we end the Liturgical Year B, Jesus invites to confront the truth about ourselves. Have we been loyal Christian subjects of Jesus, our King? Have we been faithful to His commandments? Have we followed His directives to live upright lives? Have we zealously proclaimed the truth of the Gospel to the people around us? Have we become truthful in our dealings with others? Honestly, have we been men and women of truth for the sake of GOD'S KINGDOM? God's truth hurts but it will definitely set us free!!! Amen!

#103. THE STORY OF THE GENEROUS KING: Everyday, a great king who is famous for his generosity, receives countless visitors asking for a favor. It happened one time that a beggar approached the kind king and begged him for a morsel of bread. Being so generous, the king gave him a cartful of flour, butter and milk so that the beggar can bake his bread and have a steady supply of food.

Again, when a homeless peasant asked to be allowed to sleep in the castle barn, the great king gave the homeless wanderer wood, nails and other materials and even a land title! He donated a parcel of land so the peasant can build for himself a modest home to live! God is never outdone in generosity!!!

This is the 34th Sunday and the Last Sunday in Ordinary Time. On the 22nd, we have the feast of St. Cecilia, Virgin and Martyr and patroness of sacred music. On the 23rd, we honor three saints namely: St. Clement 1, Pope and Martyr; St. Columban, Abbot and Irish monk to France; and Bl. Miguel Agustin Pro. S.J. from Guadalupe, Mexico famous for exclaiming "Long Live Christ the King" "Vivo Cristo Rey". On the 24th, we have the memorial of St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Martyr Companions as seeds of Christianity in Vietnam. On the 25th, we honor St. Catherine of Alexandria, Virgin and patron saint of philosophers, preachers and young unmarried women. This is also Thanksgiving Day in the USA. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin. Happy Thanksgiving Day to ALL.


