Test content The literacy test is divided into 4 sections: you will not be tested for your knowledge of the English national curriculum or the way you can teach it. The test must be completed within 45 minutes, unless you have been granted special arrangements. The total number of available markers ranges from 41 to 49, depending on the test. These are broken down as follows: spelling section - 10-point punctuation mark - 15-point comprehension section - between 10 and 12 marks All literacy tests have been statistically calibrated against a benchmark test. As with multiple tests, the tests are not the same. This is because each test has different questions, but they are all of an equivalent standard. A test with slightly harder questions has a slightly lower pass grade and a test with slightly simpler questions has a slightly higher pass grade. For more information about literacy test content and format, see the literacy test specification. Spelling section You must first complete the spelling section. This is the only part of the test that may not be revisited once you complete it. The spelling range is an audio test that you will listen to through headphones. If you are sitting on the non-audio version of the test, you must select the correct spelling from a list. The words tested are the ones that you can reasonably expect to be used in your professional role as a teacher. The words are not particularly opaque or technical and are often used in professional font. You will not be penalized if you accept American English use if you are asked to spell a word that has a suffix -ise or -ize. In all other cases, you must use the usual British usage. Punctuation section This section tests whether you can understand and apply punctuation rules. The correct and consistent use of punctuation is an essential aspect of a teacher's literacy. You are prompted to insert punctuation into a piece of font. You are not obligated to remove or rewrite sections of the passage. The passage may contain cases where punctuation is acceptable but not essential. Non-essential punctuation marks added to the passage are not evaluated. As of November 30, 2016, the punctuation area will contain a screen counter. This counter allows candidates to track the number of punctuation marks added and quickly verify that all punctuation marks have been added. This change to the punctuation mark does not affect the way it is marked or the method used to evaluate punctuation. Grammar section This section tests whether you can identify text that does not match good grammatical practice. You are expected to distinguish between text that makes sense and clearly conveys its intended meaning and the text that does not. They are not tested for your knowledge of grammatical terms, but for your knowledge of how to use grammar correctly. In the grammar section, you must create a short, continuous prose passage. At 4 or more points in the text, you will be prompted to select the most appropriate selection for insertion to complete the passage. UnderstandingSection This section tests your ability: identify key points in a text distinguishbetween facts and opinions retrieve facts and key points make inferences and deductions evaluate meaning and status You are prompted to re-work, organize and structural information. The test uses texts such as documents published by local and national government agencies, schools and the education press. Excerpts from websites and national newspapers are also used.
