

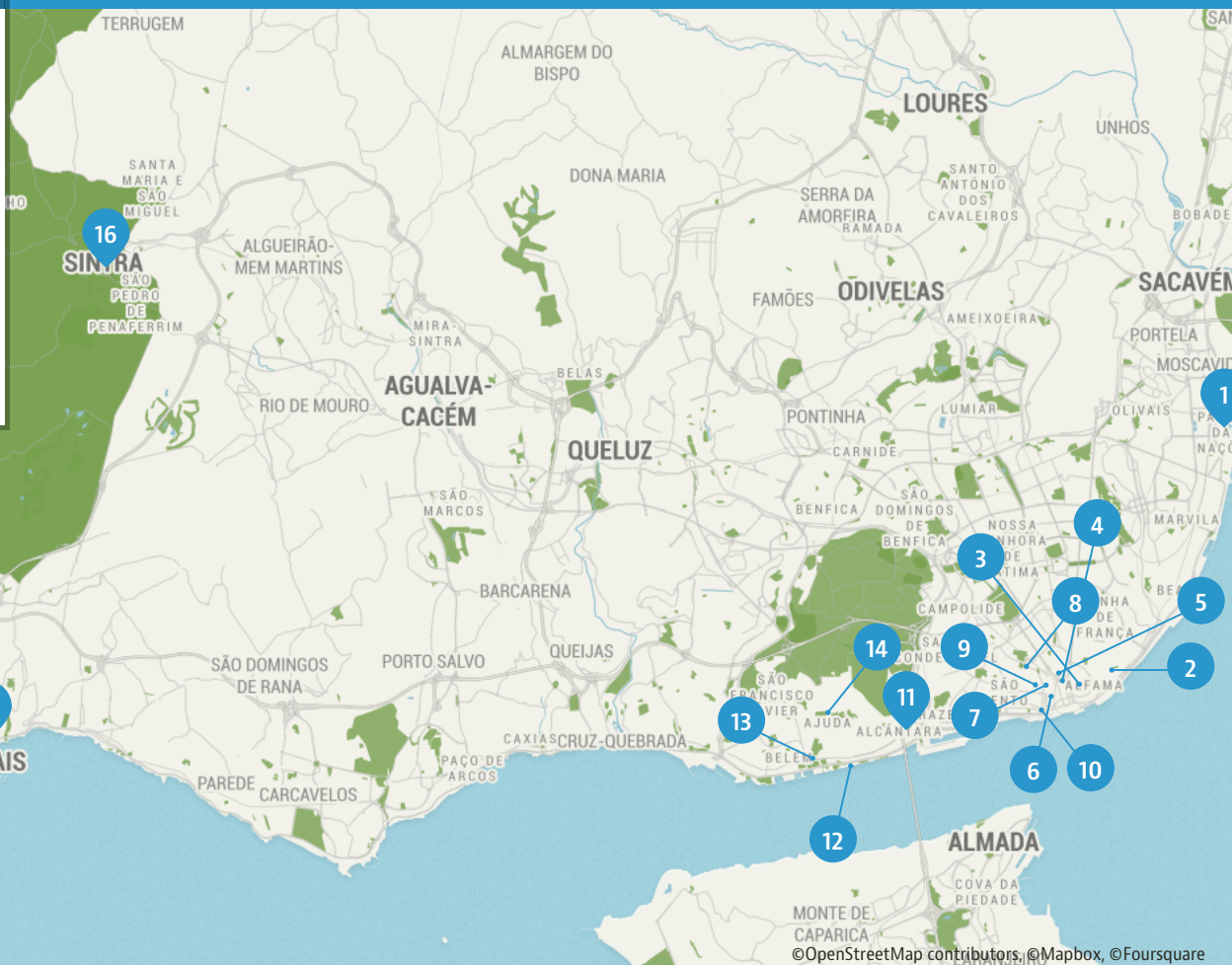
Weekend in Lisbon
