TRADITION – PRIDE – EXCELLENCE – COMMUNITY

In the late 1960's, Marin Catholic inherited the old stadium grandstands from College of Marin. For the past 50 years, those grandstands have witnessed the crowning of more than four dozen Homecoming Queens, championships in football, soccer, and lacrosse, and some very special hugs with participants in the Special Olympics. If only these stands could talk.

Over the past 10 years, Marin Catholic has spent more than \$60,000 repairing these stands to keep them up to code and safe for spectators. Now, it is time to replace them with a stadium complex that reflects the tradition, pride and excellence of Marin Catholic.

One of the mottos Marin Catholic lives by is "When you do it, do it right." That is our goal with the stadium complex. Rather than replace an old grandstand with a new one, we are looking to maximize the space by providing a first-class facility that enhances the overall student experience. Far beyond stadium seats, the new stadium complex will feature a state-of-the-art strength and conditioning center that will be utilized by the faculty in the curriculum, and by all student-athletes and sports teams. With the current strength and conditioning room

existing in the designed storage space of the Student Center, this enhancement will also reclaim the desperately needed upper campus storage space.

Also located underneath the new ADA compliant stadium grandstands, will be an ADA compliant elevator, two locker rooms, showers, a training room, a coach's office, a snack shack, and full bathrooms for student-athletes and the community.

Two new additions will also speak to the Marin Catholic tradition and pride. At the top of the grandstands behind the new double-sized press box will be the new Alumni Deck. With panoramic views of the field, the watershed, and Mt. Tamalpais, this space will be utilized for a variety of community events and will feature the rich history of athletic accomplishments on the walkway.

The centerpiece of the project will be a five-foot bronze Wildcat that will be displayed at the front and center of the new grandstand. Creating a new tradition, all student-athletes, as they head out to the center of the field from the locker room, will touch the Wildcat in remembrance to those athletes who have gone before them in battle and pursuit of athletic excellence.



The new stadium complex will include a state of the art weight room, concession stand, alumni deck and locker room.





Understanding Endowment

What was your Marin Catholic experience like?

I enjoyed my college experience, but my Marin Catholic experience was phenomenal!

You recently made a memorial gift to our scholarship fund to honor your late father, Ray Dal Pogetto. Why make the jump to a 5 year, \$25,000 endowment pledge?

I heard someone say, "You spend the first 20 years of your business life trying to make a living. You spend the next 20 trying to make a difference." I started to ask myself how can I make a difference? Part of making a difference is that at a certain point it becomes about your legacy. When it is all said and done . . . what will the next generation experience? I feel that education is the foundation of who people become. I'd like my gift to impact others for that reason. With the loss of my dad, I started to think about things differently. Most people start to give as they start to think of their mortality. I want to enjoy life. I'm passionate about what I do, and now I get to think of others.

Words are funny. As a former sixth grade teacher, I would often find myself asking students if they knew the exact definition of a word. Typically, they would quickly respond, "Yes!". However, when prompted to define it further, they would stumble with specificity, giving the general connotation of the word or telling me something like, "I know it is a good thing!"

Similar to my former students, up until these past few years as a school administrator, the word 'endowment' would render me grasping for clarity.

"I know it is something good for a school..." was about as much as I could say on the topic.

Now, after two years as the Director of Advancement and Alumni for Marin Catholic, the word 'endowment' resonates in my mind each time I hear it, conjuring the phrase . . .

"It is essential for the long term growth of a school."

Marin Catholic's **Bishop Thomas A. Daly Endowment** was established to aggressively respond to the urgent, growing need for Tuition Assistance. The amount of money that Marin Catholic can give toward financial support is directly related to the amount of interest that the **Bishop Thomas A. Daly Endowment** 'kicks off' annually. Technically, the 'endowed' money is a corpus of money whose principal cannot be touched; it should grow and grow. The more money sitting in the endowment, the larger the amount of annual interest earned, which can be allocated to families in need.

Annually, Marin Catholic gives out over \$1.1 million dollars in financial assistance, benefiting approximately 29% of our current families in need. This tuition assistance is paid for via a combination of the interest earned off the endowment and funds from the operating budget. The larger the endowment, the less money that is pulled from the general operating budget and the more money that remains to be spent on our current student programs.

Upon his appointment to being the first lay president of the school, President Navone made it one of his primary goals to grow the endowment, and he has been true to his word. Since May of 2011, the endowment has tripled in the first year and half of his presidency, growing from \$1.2 million dollars to \$4 million in gifts and pledges.

"We have an opportunity," Navone said of the endowment. "We have a chance to put Marin Catholic on stable financial ground in a way that will lead to the continued long-term excellence of our school. I am tremendously proud of what our students experience day to day, but if we want to become widely recognized as the top Catholic, college preparatory school in Northern California, we must address the growing financial assistance needs without putting the burden on current families. The **Bishop Thomas A. Daly Endowment** is the way to do this."

A friendship born out of a business partnership, Paul Eveloff saw how 'Joe' had the ability to instantly connect to all children. "Joe just got it, totally," said Mr. Eveloff. "He'd sit down with a group of kids and within ten minutes they would be telling him their life story. He was like a grandfather to them."

Eveloff sees his work at the Parker Foundation as an extension of the values he learned in his own family. Growing up as the grandson of a Russian, Austrian and Polish Jewish Immigrant, the phrase "We are here but for the kindness of strangers" was a way of thinking passed down to him. Mr. Eveloff continues to pay it forward with the Parker Foundation and his own philanthropic initiatives outside of Marin Catholic.

The Parker Foundation is well represented annually at Marin Catholic's Scholarship Dinner where benefactors and award recipients meet and share a meal. Vito Bizanelli – Theology





Bryan Jaeger, English Department Head, describes the contest for our students: "It promotes poetry as both an artistic outlet as well as an opportunity to make note or even to make sense of the world around us. It inspires the fires of creativity and fuels the reflection of our students." The English Department chose this year's theme: "Empathy: A Climb Into Skin" from Harper Lee's *To Kill A Mockingbird*.

In the following excerpt from *To Kill a Mockingbird*, we hear Atticus's sage advice for his daughter, Scout. Delivered through metaphor, Atticus's lesson is about empathy.

"First of all," he said, "if you can learn a simple trick, Scout, you'll get along a lot better with all kinds of folks. You never really understand a person until you consider things from his point of view --"

"Sir?"

-- until you climb into his skin and walk around in it."

This year's assignment was to compose a poem in which students reflect on a time they were similarly prompted to climb into another's skin, to empathize with his or her situation, and then explore the resulting understanding they gained. Students were asked to poetically describe the circumstances, the individual whose point of view was shared, and the resulting effect on their own perspective. The result was a range of beautifully written poems, which proved to be difficult in selecting this year's winners.

Marin Catholic High School senior, Karen Monterroso, has volunteered over 200 hours at Marin General Hospital. She has spent time working in the volunteer office, the reception desk and has staffed the S.M.I.L.E. cart—Students Making Illness a Little Easier. Volunteers who staff the S.M.I.L.E. cart visit patients with a variety of goodies such as lip balm, hand lotion, puzzles and pens. It helps to make days a little brighter with visits from student volunteers like Karen.

When reflecting on her time at MGH, Monterroso shared, "It has been a great experience volunteering at MGH, getting to know different people who work in different departments, helping/cheering up those who are sick and don't have company, and happily giving directions to people who may need assistance." Monterroso has wanted to work in the medical field since she was a child. She was inspired by her own nurse, and having two younger siblings has developed her strong desire for helping younger children. These things, along with her time at Marin General and the nurses she has met along the way, have led her to pursue a degree in nursing from San Francisco State beginning in the Fall.

Monterroso was one of nine high school volunteers to receive a scholarship from Marin General Hospital which will be applied toward her tuition at San Francisco State. Monterroso reflects on this: "Receiving the scholarship was a true honor because I feel as if I belong to an amazing community. Volunteering at MGH has been a great experience, especially seeing things that you don't see everyday."

Freeing Slaves in Sudan

Most people are inaccurately taught that slavery was abolished years ago. Slavery still exists today in places like Sudan, but it is covered up. Few news stations choose to inform us about the ongoing slavery problem in our world today, so most of us don't even know that we can help. But we can.

With the leadership of Joe Tassone, Religion and Social Studies teacher and moderator for the St. Vincent De Paul club (SVDP), Marin Catholic took steps (literally) to raise money and spread awareness of slavery in Sudan. The walk, hosted along with Christian Solidarity International (CSI), brought over 130 people to walk together for the freedom of slaves.

It takes \$100 to free one slave and give them a "sack of hope" which provides them with necessary items to survive. Every cent counts and every \$100 raised is another smile from a freed slave. According to Tassone, over \$20,000 was raised in Marin and as a result, 200 slaves will be freed and given a "sack of hope." He states, "I am so glad to be working at a school that really practices 'Faith, Knowledge, and Service' and tries to love its neighbors, as Christ loves us."

Joining the community on the walk was ex-slave Keer Aleu who was intentionally blinded at the age of six. Despite this, he carries himself with poise and joy. He is fluent in English with less than two years of lessons. In addition, Heidi McGinness, Director of Outreach for CSI as well as a videography crew joined the community for the walk which will be featured in a documentary about Keer. Keer loved meeting and chatting with kids his own age.

"The spirit and participation was amazing. We are very blessed to have Joe and his team continue to focus us on our mission as a school through the work he does with his SVDP club," said Karen Racanello Italian teacher at Marin Catholic.

Anything Is Possible at Marin Catholic

Editor's Note: Sometimes we adults try and tell the good news of Marin Catholic. Sometimes it is best to hear it from the source, the student voice.

Faith:

Attending a private, Catholic High School may be ideal for some, off-putting to others, or like me [and ostriches] a few may put their heads in the proverbial sand, and disregard the parochial connection altogether. I have traditionally ignored the question of religion, only attending Marin Catholic High School because my parents thought I would receive an excellent value-based education that combines service, athletics, and academics seamlessly.

All my religious distancing changed this past January, when I was compelled to attend "Kairos," a four-day retreat with a third of my senior class. I amusingly imagined that the *Kairos Retreat* would aggressively attempt to convert me. Regardless of my perception, I regarded the retreat as an opportunity to leave my busy life for a few days, reconnect with old friends, and take the time to meet new ones. However, something highly unexpected happened. Through learning about my classmates' religious and spiritual connections, I became awed by and curious about the notion of God. Over the course of four days, I sat in contemplation about a higher power, and felt joy, reverence, and excitement. Although I am still not devout, **I am appreciative and respectful of the role of religion, and I am open to cultivating an earnest relationship with the Divine. I would have never had this kind of experience if I had gone to any other high school.** Moreover, I feel closer to my friends and teachers, and I feel as if I am even more a part of the greater Marin Catholic community of faithful believers.

Knowledge:

I was born and raised in Southern Marin, where I was a part of the Reed Union School District in Tiburon from first through eighth grade. In the middle of eighth grade, I was diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder Combined Type, and shortly after, I began living primarily with my mother and stepfather in Belvedere. I thought my academic struggles in elementary and middle school would follow me through high school, but the immense amount of support I received through the Academic Service Center (ASC) at Marin Catholic and from

the Marin Catholic faculty and staff in general made all the difference.

During my freshman and sophomore years, I took Resource 9 and 10 with Mrs. Katie Tuttle, where I learned skills such as time management, organization, and self-advocacy. As a kid who had trouble focusing and just couldn't sit still because of my severe impulsive disorder, I also was able to receive a 504 Plan, giving me extended time on all tests and quizzes with the option of taking them separately from the rest of the class. With the encouragement of the teachers in the ASC, my parents and I agreed that I had formulated a solid basis of learning skills and techniques by my junior year and subsequently I took an independent study period instead of Resource 11. I continued to use the weekly consultation meetings with the ASC teachers during my junior and senior year for guidance and confidence that I was on the right track in my schoolwork.

Confidence:

This simple word sums up what I most received from attending Marin Catholic.

An obvious example of my increased self-esteem, which is almost entirely attributed to being part of the ASC, is my rocky relationship with mathematics. I was disappointed in the fact that I couldn't achieve a grade higher than a D during my first semester of Algebra 1 as a freshman. As a result, I was placed in the lower math class. I felt like I was letting myself down, although I knew I was never particularly good at math. Instead of giving me a hard time, the ASC worked with the math department to help me completely turn things around. Teachers such as Katie Tuttle and Marianne Hill encouraged me to simply 'stick it out' as they helped me set up numerous meetings and tutoring sessions with my math teachers which I continued to take advantage of through my senior year. My ASC instructors and my math teachers believed in me more than I believed in myself, and, because of that, they helped me achieve something that no one in the math department had ever thought possible of a "Math C" student. During my senior year, I took an AP math class.

Math was just one subject that the ASC helped me eventually succeed in. As I slowly began to realize my capabilities, the teachers in the ASC encouraged me to challenge myself in all other academic areas. Their persistent encouragement and my motto of "Work hard. Play hard" helped me move my way up through MC's curriculum, taking all basic classes as a freshman, then one Honors class as a sophomore, then one Honors class and two AP classes as a junior, and finally one Honors class

and four AP classes as a senior, while increasing my GPA every semester. My final year's schedule at Marin Catholic included Spanish IV, AP Statistics, Art I, AP Government, AP English Literature, Honors Bioethics, and AP Biology. All of my teachers thought I was overworking myself, which I probably was, but I was determined to push my limits and prove my capabilities, just as I do in all aspects of my life.

This crazy work ethic is also demonstrated in my career in Ski Cross. When I try to explain what I do every weekend during the winter, I always receive puzzled looks. The best way to describe Ski Cross is a perilous combination of Alpine Skiing, Nascar Racing, and Roller Derby, pitting four to six people down a steep race course, which consists of forty foot jumps, massive bank turns, technical features, and the opportunity to reach speeds over fifty miles per hour. Given my competitive nature and my natural tendency toward hardcore sports (such as the intense Varsity volleyball program at Marin Catholic), my parents decided early on that I would remain a full-time, well-rounded, high school student and an amateur athlete, no matter how successful I became in the brutal world of Professional Ski Cross. I started to win national competitions, gain multiple sponsors, and eventually make my international debut at the Junior World Championship in Valmalenco, Italy. I hoped my parents would change their minds and allow me to move to the Sierra-Nevada mountain range, train with the US team, and commit singularly to the extreme sport that had begun to define me. Instead, they became more resolute, and I remained in Marin County, Monday through Friday. I have skied for Squaw Valley since I was 8 years old, and I am addicted to the fast paced, critical sport of Ski Cross that has taught me to be strong, tenacious, and fearless. Although I am ranked 31st in the world, and 1st nationally, in my age division, I am most proud of my personal victories on the slope: after every brutal, bloody fall I get up feeling blessed and ready to try again.

Service:

Away from the snow, I have been able to harness all that I have learned in Ski Cross about leadership, diversity, and management back at Marin Catholic. As one of forty Link Crew Leaders, I was selected out of hundreds of applicants for my ability to juggle school, sports, a learning disability, and social life with competence and humor. **I loved helping MC students realize that we all come from very different backgrounds, with very different skills, and ultimately, we all have very different aspirations, needs, and concerns.**

I feel as if I really make a difference when I share my difficulty of balancing a challenging academic schedule and Ski Cross with the freshman class, assuring them that they are not alone in feeling overwhelmed by obligations to extracurricular activities and school.

Future:

I knew Berkeley before I even understood what college was. My dream has always been to follow in my mother's footsteps as a sorority girl at Cal. With this said, I never thought the admissions office at a high ranking institution, let alone the University of California, Berkeley, would look past my learning disability and my faulty math scores to understand my personal life and actually take an interest in me. To this day, I don't know what specific piece of my profile Berkeley was attracted to. What surprises a lot of people is that I actually got into Cal on merits, not my successful Ski Cross career.

The majority of my philanthropic service is dedicated to an overseas organization called Free the Children (FTC). I am drawn to International Relations because of my month long trips to India and Kenya with FTC. My entire world flipped upside down after living in these rural communities, which resulted in extreme reverse culture shock when I returned home. I worked side by side with the most

poverty stricken, yet joyous, people I have ever met, and my life was changed by building schools and teaching eager students. **My perspectives on the entire world were completely altered, and since these trips I am driven towards initiating global change.** I intend to begin this large scale work by majoring in Political Science with a minor in Peace and Conflict Studies and/or Human Rights at Berkeley. With this in mind, it's rare to find a freshman in college who has a clear vision of where they see themselves in twenty years, but I dream of becoming a US Ambassador to the UN, and the amount of determination I put into my schoolwork is motivated by that aspiration.

This summer, Marin Catholic hosted its Fourth Annual Substantially Catholic seminar, a program designed for high school teachers interested in sharing the Catholic intellectual tradition in their curriculum. The four-day program focusing on Science, English and Theology featured some of the most prominent leaders in their field.

This year's keynote speaker was Father Robert Spitzer, S.J., former president of Gonzaga University and current president of the Magis Center of Reason and Faith. He discussed his newly published *New Proofs for the Existence of God* and shared his philosophy of science in regards to space-time theory and transcendent implications of contemporary big bang cosmology.

Additional speakers in the science field included Dr. Karl Van Bibber and John M. Braverman, S.J. Dr. Karl Van Bibber is a professor and Chair of UC Berkeley's Department of Nuclear Engineering. He earned his two Bachelor of Science degrees in Physics and Math at MIT, where he also earned his Ph.D. in Physics. John M. Braverman, S.J., an Assistant Professor in Biology at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia focused on evolutionary genetics and the dialog between science and religion. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Princeton University, a Master of Divinity from the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, a Master of Arts in Health Care Ethics from Loyola University Chicago, and a Ph.D. from the University of California at Davis.

Additional speakers included Dr. Gary Bouchard, a professor from Saint Anselm College in New Hampshire, who specializes in early modern lyric and narrative poetry. Dr. Bouchard team taught with Dr. David A. King, an Associate Professor of English and Film Studies at Kennesaw State University in Atlanta. Dr. King, an award-winning columnist, is also a faculty member with the Aquinas Center of Theology at Emory University, and an adjunct faculty member in the Graduate Department of Theology at Spring Hill College.

Fall Production:

12 Angry Men



In November 2012, MC's Drama Department captivated audiences with their production of the timeless courtroom drama "12 Angry Men". This work focuses on a jury as they deliberate the guilt or innocence of a defendant in a homicide case. Though the case seems open-and-shut, one holdout causes all of them to dig deeply to discover their own inner prejudices and the meaning of reasonable doubt.

Students stretched and strengthened their communication skills as they tackled the sophisticated dialogue and highly detailed storyline. Though the words remained true to the original script, the setting and costumes were updated so that it all reflected present-day sensibilities. The 12 'men' were turned into a mix of male and female characters and included students from every class level at MC.

Spring Production:

The Drowsy Chaperone

In February 2013, Marin Catholic Drama presented "The Drowsy Chaperone" on stage at the Playhouse in San Anselmo. This hilarious musical comedy opened on Broadway in 2006 and garnered 5 Tony awards. The play is actually a show-within-a-show; the narrator resides in her shabby apartment in the present day, and she describes to the audience the plot-line of her favorite musical which is set in the decadent 1920s. As she narrates, the action comes to life in her living room, and she periodically pipes in with relevant trivia about the actors, as well as humorous personal tangents. An intense tap duo, a dramatic ballad sung with a chorus in monkey costumes, and a romantic Cole Porter-esque number on roller skates (with blindfolds!) were some of the highlights of the show. This was also the first major collaboration between the drama program and the two new wizards in the Music Department, Paul Smith-Stewart '04 and Ryan Mosse.

St. Anthony Junior Retreat: LESSONS OF THE HEART

For over a decade, our Junior students have put the Gospel into action by serving those in need in one of San Francisco's most impoverished areas, the Tenderloin. In solidarity with St. Anthony's Dining Hall, the students spend the day preparing and serving meals. Typically, over 1,500 plates are served a day, 365 days a year. Some of the students chop and plate meals, while others bus dishes. We also participate in many of the outreach programs that St. Anthony's offers to its community. Students interact with the elderly at local care centers in the Tenderloin, cheering on our older brothers and sisters through daily exercises or playing a round of bingo. Others help with the Salvation Army's "Meals that Heal" program, bringing food to shut-ins, frequently being the only contact a person might have with others that day. Another group of juniors head down to the clothing program folding bins of clothes to be given to the less fortunate, and playing with the children while the parents shop for much needed wardrobe items. All students reconvene and dine with the visitors of St. Anthony's, sharing stories and lending an ear to those who have been marginalized by most of society.

No matter what area is served, students are aware that hospitality is the main focus of the service. Being the eyes, ears, and heart of Christ for others is a humbling experience for our youth and teachers that participate in this program. Each Theology class participates in this service project one time throughout the year. This retreat begins with morning Mass at our Marin Catholic St. Francis Chapel, where students have prepared prayers and intentions for the people they will be meeting later in the day. An additional visit to St. Boniface Church, which serves the Tenderloin, is another component where we can witness our call as Catholics to love one another as Jesus loves us. The Gubio Project provides a safe haven for the homeless within the walls of St. Boniface where love and good will abound. Our community sees first hand how this Franciscan effort to reach the poor has its healing effects. The day ends with students hearing a witness talk from one of the recovering addicts in the St. Anthony Recovery Program. Students are astonished at the bravery, integrity, and faith these men have. The bus ride back is usually quiet, as students are not only tired from a fulfilling day of work, but are truly pensive about the experience. A deepening of empathy for others, and gratitude for the gifts that God has given us makes the day truly a rich moment in our school year.

EL CARMEN PROJECT



"What do you do down there in El Salvador, build houses or provide clean water?"

That is probably the most asked question to everyone involved in Marin Catholic's El Carmen Project. And most people are surprised to hear the honest response.

"It is not a service trip. All we really do is spend time with the people."

What has made Marin Catholic unique for more than 60 years is the relationships formed within the community, and the El Carmen Project is simply an extension of that.

"The service actually begins when we return home," says MC President Tim Navone, who has been on the trip since its inception. "After meeting the people in El Carmen, we select students to continue their education at Colegio Santa Isabella Catholic school in a neighboring town about 20 minutes away and then our students raise the money necessary to support their studies after they return home."

After 8th grade in the local school in El Carmen, the options are slim and going to high school is not one of them. Most elect to work in a Chinese-owned textile factory.

In its second year, Marin Catholic sent down 16 students, eight whom returned for their second of three summers in El Carmen.

After weekly preparation during the school year, the second year students got a chance to work on their language skills teaching English at the Catholic school.

One of the attendees on the trip was MC alum Chris Escher '00 who served as the trip photographer. And while he was greatly impacted by his interactions with the people of El Salvador, he came away with equally powerful impressions of the Marin Catholic students.



"One surprising take away was how much I enjoyed getting to know the MC students," says Escher. "As an alumnus, I am comforted by knowing that Marin Catholic possesses such a high caliber student body. They gained so much appreciation and maturity on their visits meeting local families, visiting senior homes, and an adult orphanage for people with disabilities. The growth over the course of the week was evident and inspiring."





Honoring Frank and Lois Noonan



Original Marin Catholic Wildcat Finds Its Way Home!

Talk about a Homecoming. This one has it all.

A revered Marin Catholic icon... absent from the campus for some 50 years... suddenly reappears at our doorstep... and reveals to us an important aspect of MC history long shrouded in mystery.

It all started with a recent phone call from **Jim Clahan** (star athlete MC '54) to his pal **Hank Sandbach** (MC '56).

"Hank," says Jim. "I've got something here that I think our friends at Marin Catholic might like to have. And I think you are the right guy to carry this football back to them."

"OK, Jim," says Hank. "You've got my attention."

Thereupon, Jimmy Clahan, halfback on some of MC's earliest and most successful football squads—and son of Marin Catholic's first football coach, John Clahan, for whom Clahan Field is named—proceeds with his story on how his mother, Katherine Clahan, played a pivotal role in the creation of the original Marin Catholic Wildcat.

Marin Catholic first opened its doors in the fall of 1949. The Spring and Summer of that year were enormously busy as MC's new Administration and Faculty team wrestled with academic issues large and small. Then, too, there was another weighty and important non-scholastic matter that needed resolution.



Alumni Give Back In Honor of Dick Barteau

The late Dick Barteau was a fixture in the Marin Catholic community and athletic department. His positive attitude, care, attention, and humor left fond memories in the hearts of the athletes and students he encountered.

A strong group of young Alumni, organized this year by **Conor Pritchard '00** and **Mike McGarry '00**, donated in Dick's honor to the Marin Catholic general scholarship fund. The upcoming game, which takes place on Friday November 29, will be the ninth year of a growing post-Thanksgiving Friday flag football tradition.

Marin Catholic thanks those who attended, played, contributed, and celebrated on that day!

"What are we gonna call ourselves?" was undoubtedly a hot item of discussion during those hectic get-ready days.

"San Rafael High School athletes were the Bulldogs, and Tamalpais High were known as The Indians in those days," recalls Clahan. "And I don't remember St. Anselm's ever having a mascot, though there must have been one." (Note: the relatively small high school part of St. Anselm's School in San Anselmo closed its doors when MC opened in 1949). "All I know," continues Clahan, "is that my father and some of his colleagues at MC settled on The Wildcats, and he asked my mother to create a depiction of one that he and others at the school could use on printed game programs, sweaters and jackets, and so on. She came up with one, it did its job, and then it promptly disappeared amongst Clahan family treasures."

"I've thought many times over the years about that first MC Wildcat my mother designed," says Clahan, "but I could never find it. I like to think its turning up now—and its return to the school—has something to do with current plans for renovating our fabled athletic complex, where my father once coached football and I later scored touchdowns."

Jim Clahan went on from scoring touchdowns at MC to a 40-year career teaching—and coaching—at Tomales High School. Last August he was honored as "Coach of the Year" by some 400 attendees at the First Annual Kickoff Classic benefiting the Tomales High School Football Team. Jim and his wife Steph live in the countryside west of Petaluma.



Thanks to Jim Clahan, the original and venerable Marin Catholic Wildcat has come home to stay, soon to be taking up residence in a place of honor along the great wall in the main entrance to the Freitas Memorial Gymnasium.


1970's



