ROSELLE GROWING GUIDE

THE MUST GROW PLANT YOU NEVER KNEW YOU NEEDED



Roselle is a heat-loving, tropical plant known for its striking red calyxes, which are used to make tangy teas, syrups, and jams. With tall, upright growth and creamy hibiscus-like flowers, roselle adds beauty and function to any garden – attracting pollinators and offering a harvest that's as useful as it is delicious. It thrives in full sun and is easy to grow from seed, making it a perfect pick for seasonal gardeners.

Harvest roselle about 2-3 weeks after the flower blooms, when the calyx (the red, fleshy part surrounding the seed pod) is thick, glossy, and fully formed – but before the seed pod inside becomes tough or woody.

Harvesting regularly keeps the plant producing!

How To Grow Roselle

START FROM SEED

Sow seeds directly into warm soil once all threat of frost has passed.

PLANTING

Plant in well draining soil and give 36 - 48" of space.

GROWING

Keep seedlings moist until they are established. When the plant is about 12-18 inches tall, pinch the growing tip to encourage branching. You'll get more flowering stems and a bigger harvest later.



Roselle thrives in neglect and will do great in less than ideal conditions, so don't over tend it. amend soil with compost at planting and topdress with a balanced organic fertilizer
