

DAFFODILS NARCISSUS

arcissus, a group that includes daffodils and paperwhites, are the very first flowers to bloom on our farm in spring, and after a long rainy winter, they're a sight for sore eyes. These gems have gotten a bad rap because many people associate them with the glaring school-bus yellow, dollar-a-dozen bunches from grocery stores. But they're actually amazingly diverse: Besides varying shades of yellow, some have peach, salmon, white, and apricot blooms. Each stem might have a huge trumpet-shaped flower or many miniature ones. Some are fragrant; others could easily be mistaken for peonies or orchids.

These beauties are extremely easy to grow, they're deer-proof, and they take harsh weather in stride. They also multiply rapidly, which means that if you make a small initial investment in bulbs, you'll be rewarded with more and more blooms in the years to come. But the best thing about growing these delightful flowers is that they arrive in early spring, long before the rest of the garden wakes up. Over time, they've earned their place as one of my all-time favorite groups of flowers.

We've been growing narcissus for more than a decade, and we're always on the lookout for treasures to add to our ever-growing collection that now includes more than a hundred varieties. We regularly trial new narcissus, searching for those with unique colors and scents that are also good for cutting. I usually think we'll find a handful to add, but we often find dozens—and I'm already making plans for our next trial patch.

Spring is an ideal time to make note of varieties you see blooming and want to add to your garden for next year. Bulb companies sell out of specialty and popular varieties quickly, and if you have your shopping list ready when narcissus ordering opens up in late summer, you'll have the best chance at getting the ones you want.




AT-A-GLANCE SCHEDULE

SPRING: Harvest, and make note of varieties you see blooming and want to add for next year.

EARLY SUMMER: Divide bulbs every three to four years.

MID- TO LATE SUMMER: Order new varieties.

AUTUMN: Plant bulbs.



week of vase life. Flowers can also be picked when they've opened more, just keep in mind that they won't last quite as long. Wear gloves when harvesting narcissus, as they ooze a slimy sap that can cause skin irritation.

This slimy sap can shorten the vase life of other flowers significantly if they're combined with cut narcissus. To avoid affecting other blooms in an arrangement, you'll need to "condition" the narcissus first. To do this, place freshly cut stems into cool water, on their own, for three to four hours; during that time, the stem ends will callus over and the sap (which will inhibit other flowers from taking up water) will stop flowing.

VASE LIFE TRICKS

Generally, all narcissus varieties have a vase life of nearly a week if harvested before the flowers are fully open. When adding narcissus stems to arrangements, don't recut those that you've conditioned because the sap will start leaking all over again. Of course, you can create an arrangement solely of narcissus, either just one variety or several, and the sap won't be an issue.





PLANNING CARDS



Each card includes the variety name, photo, height, classification, and bloom time (early, mid, or late spring.)

These planning cards are a great way to build out color palettes for bouquets or weddings, though you can use these cards to plan however you'd like, whether that's by color, height, classification, or bloom time.

You can print these cards on your home printer, or send the file to your local print shop to print on heavier weight cardstock if you want your set to hold up better over time. For a small fee, most print shops will even cut them for you!

We hope these planning cards help you discover new varieties and plan the patch that's right for you.
