About Dogma Training

Our story begins in 2002 when Founder, Megan Stanley, adopted her first dog, Guinniss. She quickly learned that the sweet and affectionate boy at home became a scary and reactive dog once out in the real world. Guinniss was terrified of our urban environment and demonstrated his fear through overthe-top reactions. Megan knew that through patience and the right training approach, she could teach Guinniss that the world was safe and help him integrate successfully into the busy human environment.

Guinniss was Megan's best teacher and is credited as being Dogma's Canine Co-Founder. Through her work with Guinniss, Megan learned that there were limited options for dogs with reactivity and fear concerns. All options available utilized punishment, which Megan knew put Guinniss at risk to become a dangerous dog due to the behavioural fallout from such harsh methods. Facilities were operated by well-intentioned dog owners who put far too many dogs in groups with only one or two inexperienced supervisors with little to no education on canine behaviour. She knew then that she needed to create an organization to set the standard for care and training and advocate for improving the lives of dogs and the people who love them.

Megan quickly began attending seminars, apprenticed through The Calgary Humane Society and earned her Certified Pet Dog Trainer (CPDT-KA) designation. The first of only four in Canada to obtain her Certified Behaviour Consultant Canine (CBCC-KA) designation, she has become a leader in the industry. She was a founding member of Pause4Change Animal Rescue Foundation, is the President of The Guinniss Foundation and was the first Canadian to sit as Chair for the Association of Professional Dog Trainers in 2018. She currently serves as Vice-Chair for the The Canadian Association of Professional Dog Trainers and as a Board Member for Community Therapy Dogs Society.

Dogma opened its doors in 2008 and quickly became the go-to place to visit for complete dog education, day school and training. At Dogma, we know that successful dog training is about relationship building. It's about communicating with your four-legged companion, building a relationship based on mutual respect and learning together. It's positive, it's peaceful and, yes, it's productive.

As part of the Dogma difference, we are the only facility to offer a variety of education programs ran entirely by reward-based certified dog trainers. Dogma was the first to have only certified trainers conduct training, segregate play groups based on size and play style, mandate an assessment before dogs were allowed to attend day school, maintain strict capacity numbers, ensure a low staff-dog ratio, and provide rubber-flooring and solid, high walls to ensure each dogs' safety.

We maintain the highest standards of excellence through staff training, 100% supervision, the lowest staff-dog ratio, facility design, equipment used, and we make every decision to ensure the emotional, physical, and behavioural well-being of each dog in our care. We continue to innovate dog training to ensure training is easy and accessible. We have training to fit every budget and schedule and work with any breed or behaviour.

Community and giving back are extremely important to Dogma. We provide free education and training to many rescue groups around Calgary, conduct regular fundraising initiatives, and do our part to help elevate the industry and its future leaders.

About Dogma Academy

For too many years, there were not options for people to go to school for dog training. Instead, you would apprentice under a trainer, self-educate through books, attend seminars, and hopefully go on to write your CPDT-KA exam. However, as the industry is unregulated, anyone can claim to be a dog trainer without any real education.

Many people sought out Megan to apprentice under her and she also was also a mentor trainer with Animal Behavior College. It was quickly apparent that dog trainers were not gaining the knowledge, or the hands-on skills required to be confident and successful as trainers. As a result, she launched the Dog Trainer Apprenticeship program in 2009. Since then, she has gone on to train hundreds of students and evolved the program to where it is today, the leading Canadian dog training school. The success in our program is apparent both by the quality of our graduates and by the reputation we have earned. This is not a crash course in training and/behaviour as it takes 12-24 months to complete. It's intensive, but flexible.

Like many trainers in the dog industry, Shelley found Dogma when she found herself with a dog of her own presenting challenging behaviours which she was unsure of how to address. At the time, Shelley owned and operated a successful business as a certified Equine Therapist practicing holistic treatments along with working with disabled youth through respite work. When a 6-week-old puppy, Gus, injected himself into Shelley's life through a client at the time her professional life changed directions. Even at a young age Gus was beginning to show behaviors such as challenges interacting with other dogs, guarding food and reactivity to people that Shelley was lost with how to handle. Through many hours of extensive research into training facilities in Calgary looking for a trainer, Dogma kept appearing as the go to experts in the industry. Rather than hire a trainer through Dogma, the apprenticeship program caught her eye and she figured why not just become a trainer! With no expectation to use a dog training certification professionally, Shelley enrolled into the Dogma Academy in 2012.

Shortly after enrolling into the Academy, a part-time position as a group class trainer assistant was posted by Dogma and Shelley jumped at the opportunity to join the team. As she progressed through the apprenticeship program it became evident that dog training, specifically working with trainers and clients in the industry, was her true passion and should be turned into a career. The once part-time assistant role quickly turned into a full-time trainer position and following successful completion of the DCBC certification, she progressed to Head Trainer at Chinook, then Manager and is currently Director of Behavior and Education. Continued education has always been important to Shelley and throughout her journey she has achieved her CPDT-KA and is a certified Fear Free Trainer.

Shelley currently shares her home with her two dogs, Gus and Ferro, husband, Nick, and two daughters, Hannah and Isabelle. Although Gus was not what many would traditionally define as a dream dog, he is Shelley's soul dog that continues to inspire and influence her work with fear and reactivity cases to unlock every dog's full potential. Gus being on the more extroverted side, it seemed fitting that Ferro found Shelley as a shy, under confident 6 months old dog. Learning firsthand the challenges, and subsequently the joys, of living with fear and reactivity behaviors with a family dog has been the driving force behind Shelley's passion for dog training.

Through a mentorship with Megan, Shelley found an additional passion in the industry helping others starting their journey to become certified dog trainers. She is devoted to teaching other trainers and making fear free training/handling the industry standard. Her values and mission have always aligned with Dogma's, and she is beyond excited to continue making a positive impact on the lives of dog's and those that love them.

Student Agreement

By enrolling in a Dogma Dog Trainer Apprenticeship program, I understand and agree that:

- Any form of client, Dogma team or dog abuse will serve as grounds for dismissal with no refund of program fees.
- Inappropriate, disruptive, profane, or argumentative behaviour of any kind will not be tolerated towards Dogma staff or your fellow students. Violation of this policy may result in dismissal from the program.
- Dogma will dismiss any student found under the influence of or in possession of drugs or alcoholic substances while working.
- Appropriate dress while representing Dogma is required. This includes looking clean and professional, not wearing ripped or soiled clothing, and wearing close-toed shoes.
- The student shall provide any services to the best of the student's ability to use positive motivational training methods and represent Dogma in a professional manner. The student shall adhere to Dogma's philosophy and training methods.
- Attendance in the program sessions is recorded. You will get out of the program what you put into it. It is expected that students will actively participate in all classes, workshops and mentor sessions.
- A minimum grade of 80% is required for graduation. Tests can be redone for \$175 CAD each.
- The student will obtain their CPDT-KA/CBCC-KA or CDBC designation within 2 years of graduation.
 The DDT and/or DCBC designation can no longer be used by the student if they do not obtain these designations. It is the student's responsibility to report their certification status to Dogma Academy.
- All program materials including, but not limited to written materials, CD's and DVD's may not be
 copied or duplicated without the express written consent of Dogma. This contract does not give or
 imply said consent. The student further agrees that under no circumstance will she/he sell any
 portion of the Dogma curriculum either during or after the program.
- The students will not exchange any personal information, or socialize with, existing or perspective clients, of the company in person, over the phone, e-mail, or via social media.
- Attendance in each workshop session is mandatory. If a student must miss a session, they are
 required to make up this class and required testing before final testing. This is completed only as
 the schedule permits.
- A leave of absence may be requested. These will be granted for a maximum of 4 months. During this time, the student will not have access to the program materials and sessions. Payment plans will continue during this period, unless otherwise approved by Megan Stanley.
- All program fees are non-refundable.
- The student agrees to the payment plan selected on their registration form and understands that all
 fees are non-refundable. You are responsible to pay your full program fees, even if you do not
 complete the program.
- By accepting our terms & conditions, you agree that this contractual agreement must always be followed. Any violation of this contract will serve as grounds for dismissal from the program and may even lead to necessary legal action.

Code of Conduct

The Dogma of a Dogma Dog Trainer/Certified Behaviour Consultant (DDT/DCBC)

Dogma Dog Trainers and Certified Behaviour Consultants (DDT/DCBCs) will be responsible to conduct their services to the highest level of professionalism and in an ethical manner. The below outlines enforceable standards and requirements which DDT/DCBC's must agree to abide to retain their designation. A DDT/DCBC agrees to represent themselves by following and conducting business in accordance with the below guidelines:

Position Statement:

Dogma Dog Trainers and Certified Behaviour Consultants (DDT/DCBCs) believe that dog-friendly, reward-based training methods are the most efficient and effective. It is our philosophy to educate and improve the human-dog relationship based on mutual respect, and to do so with the least intrusive methods. We do not support any use of force, intimidation, or physical manipulation in training, as we see these methods as unethical, inefficient, and ineffective. They risk harming and deteriorating the human-dog bond. Our training is taught with LIMA compliant methods and focuses on showing the dog how to be successful. We are committed to using only modern science-based methods.

DDT/DCBC's Believe in:

- fostering and enhancing the human-canine bond
- developing a solid, positive relationship with your dog
- · rehabilitating behavioral issues through education, awareness and reward
- preventing surrenders and improving canine reputations through education, positive training and socialization
- providing comprehensive dog owner education, training and support to enhance their relationship with their dog while helping create well-manned canine citizens
- supporting local animal rescue groups through fundraising efforts, sharing of knowledge and donations

Responsibilities:

- A DDT/DCBC is responsible to their canine clients by working only through the most humane methods. All training is to be conducted based on mutual respect and should not cause physical or emotional distress toward the dog. All training and behavior modification methods must be based on accurate and current scientific research.
- A DDT/DCBC is responsible to their human clients by providing the highest level of service in the
 most ethical way possible. All services shall be rendered without discrimination. Clients shall be
 shown respect and the trainer should understand that they are not dog trainers. All services shall
 be delivered through integrity and honesty.
- A DDT/DCBC is responsible to colleagues, including competition, through conducting honest and
 professional business practices. Public defamation of other trainers will not be tolerated. Even for
 those that utilize different training methods, a DDT/DCBC's primary role is to focus on leading by
 example and educating others on the most efficient and humane methods possible.
- A DDT/DCBC shall be dedicated to continuing education through attending conferences, seminars
 and workshops. They will stay up to date on the latest methods by reading books, researching
 online, and holding professional memberships such as the APDT.
- If conducting private training, group classes, or running a dog training business, a DDT/DCBC will
 obtain their CPDT-KA designation within two years of obtaining their DDT designation.

 A DDT/DCBC will take part in Dogma's referral network and conduct themselves in a professional manner. This will include a listing on the Dogma academy website at www.dogmaacademy.com and the online community.

A DDT/DCBC will have their designation revoked for any, but not limited to, the following:

- Is found guilty of animal cruelty
- Uses any of the following tools in their training: choke chain, choke collar, prong collar, freedom collar, illusion collar, shock collar, vibration collar or a pinch collar
- Uses any of the following training techniques in their training: dominance-based, physical force, fear, intimidation, alpha rolls, or anything that has been proven to cause harm to the dog physically or mentally

As a dog trainer, it is our responsibility to ensure the overall well-being of the dogs in our care. We understand that their owners do not share our same level of knowledge/experience with dogs and are seeking our expertise. A DDT/DCBC will conduct ourselves professionally and be empathetic towards our clients' needs and limitations. We will support fellow dog trainers and encourage learning and growth. We will represent our profession proudly and with integrity. We are lucky to be able to do what we do and are grateful to be trusted to train the dogs in our care.
