Home Health and Staffing Agencies

How to stay safe while providing care at home, ICF, and ALF

Ensuring the health and safety of all persons and maintaining their highest level of well-being is our collective health care goal. In light of the recent spread of COVID-19, CMS and others are providing additional guidance to help control and prevent the spread of the virus. Key resources for assisted living and other living facilities, home health services, and at-home care for individuals/families are listed here.

Key strategies

- visitor restriction
- caregiver screening prior to entering
- cancellation of all group setting activities
- practicing social distancing
- promoting frequent hand hygiene

Efforts should be made to increase phone and virtual contact with persons in facilities where these limitations reduce their socialization opportunities. Plans should be made with EMS providers about revised processes for moving patients in or out of the facility. Agency and other staff who typically move from one facility to another should have limited mobility among facilities if possible.

Key strategies

- following infection prevention and control practices from the CDC
- not providing care when the health care provider has signs and symptoms of respiratory illness

Key strategies

- People should adhere to home isolation until the risk of secondary transmission is thought to be low
- Use of a separate bedroom where the patient can recover without sharing immediate space with others
- The patient and other household members have access to appropriate, recommended personal protective equipment (at a minimum, gloves, and facemask) and are capable of adhering to precautions recommended as part of home care or isolation (e.g., respiratory hygiene and cough etiquette, hand hygiene)
