

Confetti Stamped Halloween Treat Bags

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Hey, everyone! This is Kristen from k.becca, and today we're making confetti stamped Halloween treat bags. I'm using these two and a half inch by four and a half inch treat bags that I found in the party goods section at Michael's. They come in a lot of different colors, but I wanted to use black because it's a Halloween project.

I've seen this technique in several different places, and I thought it would be really fun to translate it to Halloween treat bags. It's super simple. and you can make a bunch of bags really quickly.

You'll need a pencil with an unused eraser and a few different colors of ink. I'm using Crimson Copper, Rocket Red Gold, and Starlite Black Dew Drop inks for this. First, you'll place a piece of scrap paper beneath your treat bag. I like to have this piece of scrap paper here because I like to put some of the dots going off the sides of the bag, and it just helps keep your workspace clean.

You're going to load your eraser with the first ink color and then just start stamping. Just randomly place your dots. I like to do, for this size bag, about twelve to fifteen of each color seems to work out well. And I reload my eraser (with ink) after every time I stamp. Sometimes, I'll go two times because it's nice to get those little dots that have a bit of a lighter impression.

Alright, so I'm done with my first color, and if you want to take the time you can just go and actually wash the eraser off, but what I do is I just have a paper towel here, and I just stamp it out until pretty much of the ink is gone as possible. And then you'll just do the same thing for the second and third ink colors...

I'm just finishing up with my last ink color, and the bag is ready to label and fill with candy now. I'm using the trick-or-treat labels from my Ye Olde Halloween collection, and they come in four colors. I like to put the label on the bag first because if you try to do it after you fill it with the candy it's all bumpy, and it's really hard to get the label down.

Line it up in the center about two thirds of the way down the label. And I'm going to be filling these with chocolate eyeballs (candy). After your bag is filled, you just fold over the closure and seal it on the back, and the treat bag is done.
