Discussion

We know how Jesus answered this question. He took the role of a servant and He washed the feet of His disciples. Today's text is a lesson in humility and obedience and love. It was the ultimate act of humility designed to show them, the soon to be founders of the church, the duty of humility. He didn't teach them about humility, He showed them, in an unforgettable way. He became a servant. A thousand words would not leave so deep an impression as this one deed. John 13:15 - "I have given you an example to follow. Do as I have done to you."

Study

A servant's heart has more to do with your relationship with God than it has to do with your desire to be recognized for your good deeds. It's showing your love to another human being by simply being who God intended you to be. It's about seeing a need and fulfilling it without any strings attached. It's about making yourself uncomfortable so that someone else could be comfortable. It's about showing Christ's love through your actions and words. And finally, it's about touching the lives of those around you with such a gentle kindness that your act will be remembered for years to come.
