I love Halloween. This is my second favorite holiday only until Christmas, but holds a special place in my heart because I get back-to-back goodness for my birthday and then, 24 hours later, all the goodness Halloween brings. Folks at DualBoot Games (creators of other live wallpapers like Celtic Garden HD) have whipped another of us, this time all haunted and creepy, just in time for Halloween. It's called Haunted House HD, and as far as live wallpapers go, although it's time sensitive, it's probably one of the most detailed I've come across. From the moment you pop open live wallpaper selector and choose Haunted House HD, the Halloween vibe washes over. The camera pans by the creepy house, shaded by fog, as the lights flicker in and out intermittently. Jack-o-lanterns guard the doorway, and terrifying messages appear across the door with blood. Everything is pretty smooth, despite the fact that there's so much going on. The door opens and closes itself when the camera wipes back, the lights light up, revealing the silhouette of the window and the flag mailbox moving up and down on its own initiative. If you want to go inside the house, you need to jump to the fully loaded settings menu and change the camera view. The inside of the house is just like (if not more) occupied as blackmail. The lights continue to flicker, the fire is pale, ghostly blue, and the paintings have skulls on top of the theme face. The essential steps pulse and disappear on the floor, and strange breezes toss chandelier around. It's a lot, but it's still fun. Back to the settings menu when I said loaded, I meant it. You can choose your camera view, specify the name of your mailbox and doorway, choose the face you want for pumpkins, and separately enable or disable each variable that wallpaper provides. Sizing Walls size allows you to manoeuvre paper into position on the wall without tearing. Size also makes it easier to remove paper later. Size is a watery consistency and should be worn with a paint roll and a pan. The wall is ready to be papered when the size is dry. Priming dark walls is a good idea to prime dark walls if you use paper with a light background because it helps to hide seam inconsistencies. Use a basic white latex primer or a primer/size mixture. Areas over doors, windows or wall space that are somewhat hidden are good places to start. Following this approach better hide all the contradictions in your strips. Another good idea is to establish vertical guidelines. Keep the roll of paper where you start and make a sign half an inch smaller than the width of the paper. Then use a level or chalk line to create a vertical reference point. Paper loading begin by lining the edge of the paper about half an inch of the reference line. In doing so, you will be able to hide a series of shows through the seam. Place the roller on the floor and unroll enough to reach the ceiling. Adjust the paper in the ceiling so that your pattern matches and marks with a paper pen. Measure the ceiling label down and note that the wall is high plus two inches more. Make a small cut or mark on the bottom of the paper and fold the paper over. Trim the paper with a fold as a driver. Test your bar with the correct fit

Measure second bar setting the first bar on the spot and using it as a template. Be sure to match your pattern while leaving some extra at the top and under the trimming. Now hang your first piece, cut the third piece, hang the second piece, etc. Avoid cutting a large number of strips at once if you are not sure that your pattern is lining properly. To determine how many rolls of the room are needed: Add the total width of the walls of your feet and multiply the height. Hand it out with 30 - the average square foot used in an American-made roll - or 25 if you're using European paper. Separate the semi-roller with a normal size for the window and door. You now have a job to do; add one roll for good measure (and future patches) – a little more if your pattern has great repetitions to match. If you're not sure about your calculations, draw a picture of each wall, including measurements, and the location and size of all windows and doors. Take a sketch of your wallpaper supplier. An experienced salesperson can give advice on how many rolls you need to buy. If you put your wallpaper in order, also buy a compatible pasta and pasta brush with standard papers, or a water box of pre-stained papers. Select the paper that is created with this in mind. Here are some features to look for: High quality, machine printed, pre-trimmed papers tend to be the most problem-free. Flocked and foil papers or wallpapers with selvage edges that must be trimmed to work are challenges better left by professionals for your first time around. Patterns that are straight are easier to hang than dropped patterns. Straight patterns are called because neighborhood panels meet in a straight line, so they need a little extra figuring out when you cut and hang them. Dropped patterns are design repeats that are designed to match the panel panel, a somewhat heavier calculation to measure. Dropped patterns also require more paper to compensate for matching. Small-scale general patterns tend to camouflage uneven surfaces. But striped, shiny and solid wall coverings are best reserved for very smooth, perfectly plumb walls. It is also critical to matching the pattern scale of room size. Too big a pattern in a small room can be oppressive; too small a pattern will be lost in a large room. Bring home samples of wallpaper or wallpaper books to see which patterns work best for your purposes. Look at them in both natural and artificial light.
