Learn fun facts about Japan while practicing your multiplication.

1 Japan has the 11th highest population in the world. How many people live in the country?

$$20 \text{ million} \times 6 + 7 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \text{ million people}$$

2 Japan is actually an archipelago, which means it consists of different islands. Can you guess how many islands make up Japan? Hint, it's a lot!

$$7 (54 \times 9) + 138 \times 25 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \text{ islands}$$

3 Mt. Fuji is the highest point in Japan. How tall is this mountain?

$$3097 \times 4 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \text{ feet}$$

4 What percentage of the world's volcanoes is in Japan?

$$0.01 \times 1000 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \%$$

5 How much of the island is covered by forests?

$$17.5 \times 4 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \%$$

6 Japan's first robot was believed to have been invented in the year _____

$$192.8 \times 10 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}}$$

7 Japan's fastest train, the Shinkansen, runs at 199 miles per hour. Japan's main island, Honshu, is 810 miles long. How long would it take to go from the top of Honshu to the bottom?

$$199 \text{ mi/hr} \times \underline{\hspace{2cm}} = 810 \text{ miles}$$

8 The Shibuya Crossing in Tokyo is believed to be the world's busiest street intersection, even more crowded than Times Square! Find out how many people on average cross the street at one time.

$$25 \times 100 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \text{ people}$$

9 Japan is known for their elderly population. How many people in the country are over 100 years old?

$$6 \times 2500 + 7 \times 5000 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \text{ people}$$
