Lifespan

A German Pinscher will normally live to be between 12 and 14 years old. However it is not uncommon for a German Pinscher to live to be as old as 15, providing that it does not develop any serious health issues. Height and Weight

A fully grown German Pinscher will normally stand between 17 to 20 inches (43 to 51cm) tall at the shoulder. A healthy adult German Pinscher will normally weigh between 25 to 45 pounds (11.25 to 20.5kg). It is important to note that the weight of a healthy German Pinscher depends on how large the German Pinscher is – taller German Pinscher should weigh more.
