1 How Rent Control Drives Out Affordable Housing

Rent control has been in force for many decades, which meant to assist poorer residents, harms

far more citizens than it helps, benefits the better-off, and limits the freedom of all citizens. The rent control backfired and rent high rocketed along with the system of Key money or pakidi a social evil. The only beneficiary of Rent Control legislation is those who managed to take buildings, which come under Rent Control, on rent before the rent sky rocketed and managed to establish business. The high rent prevented other entrants in the business field and thus they succeed to avoid competition, which is also a social evil and the general public is the loser. Those who wants to enter retail business has to pay high Key money for obtaining a suitable building and has to pay high rent.

The lesson is that rent control is policy that never was justified and certainly should be scrapped. The Central Government had issued a policy paper in 1992 and a Model Rent Control Act was published by the Union Housing Department. The states that follow the direction of the Central Government direction achieved more development in the housing sector. The Kerala Law Reforms Committee headed by Late Justice V. R. Krishna Iyer in the report filed by it suggested that the Kerala Rent Control Act should be amended to balance the interest of the building owners and tenants. The Kerala Government has published the new rent control law in the name The Kerala Building (Lease, Rent Control and other facilities) Bill 2013 as Bill No.294 of 2014.

During 2001 when Mr. Atal Behari Vajpayee was the Prime minister the government of India entrusted McKinsey an international Management consultants to study about the reasons for the underdevelopment of India despite the manpower and natural resources. The McKinsey's report suggested 13 points to be implemented in order to attain growth for the Indian Economy. Out of the thirteen the ninth one was "Reform tenancy laws to facilitate market determined rents"

Even In Kerala, the Rent Control Act is not applicable to every buildings and even in every place. The buildings belonging to Government and Local bodies, buildings of Wakaf Board, Temples, churches, charitable institutions, Education Institutions and even certain buildings belonging to individuals are exempted from Rent Control Act. There seems no widespread evictions and hardships for the tenants who occupy these buildings. Whole of Kerala is not under Rent Control Act, some of the panchayaths have not applied the Act. tenants in these areas do not face any problem. The lesson we make out is that rent control is a policy that never is essential or justified and certainly should be scrapped.

During the 1960s and 70s it appeared that rent control might be the wave of the future. At that period every sector was being brought under the government control license quota raj. But even when the economy was opened to global market and benefits of globalization spread across the nation the building sector was under Rent Control and rental market remain the same. The Supreme Court of India opined that "fools build houses for wise men to live in" *

Those who wants to enter retail business has to pay high Key money for obtaining a suitable building and has to pay high rent. The result has been a virtually closed community. It is almost impossible for newcomers to find accommodation in a commercial area at a reasonable rate. People build houses for their own occupation, no entrepreneur will invest in building for renting it out. Providing housing is perceived by some as an illegitimate enterprise.

"Greedy landlords" become public enemies and the entire political apparatus is geared up to subdue them. Article 19 (1) g of the constitution provides All citizens the right to practice any profession, or to carry on any occupation, trade or business. Yet all that is really at stake is public willingness to accept the idea that some people make their living by providing housing.
