The Ancient Egyptians allocated intense amounts of resources to the construction of temples and religious centers, in keeping with the importance they placed on immortality and the afterlife.

Although the Ancient Egyptian religion is cloaked in the symbolism of myth - with chimerical Gods featuring animal heads on human bodies - it actually illustrates the beginnings of scientific thought, as the Ancient Egyptians sought to make sense of the forces of the natural world that shape their life.

On the surface, a pregnant woman with the head of a hippopotamus and the antiseptic world of the scientific laboratory couldn't have less in common, seemingly coming from different galaxies. And yet, looking at the Gods of the Ancient Egyptians is like watching the birth of modernity.

Title: Devourer of the Dead

Ammit (alt. spellings Ammet, Ammut, Amam, Amemet, Ahemait) is a demon who dwells in the Hall Of Ma'at, with the body of a lion or other big cat, the hindquarters of a hippopotamus, and the head of a crocodile. Ammit's name literally translates to "Devourer", which earned her many titles over the millennia, like "Devourer Of The Dead", "Soul Eater", "Demoness Of Death", "Devourer Of Millions", or "Devourer Who Dwell In Amenta," a valley west of the River Nile where many cemeteries were located.

There are no rites associated with Ammit, as she was not worshipped. Ammit was the personification of chaos and disorder; a representation of all that the Ancient Egyptians feared and

hated. She resides in the Hall Of Truth, dwelling beneath the Scales of Ma'at, where Osiris weighs the heart of the deceased against a feather from Ma'at's headdress by Anubis. If a heart is found to be heavier than the feather, the heart is given to Ammit to eat, dooming the deceased to the Ancient Egyptians' worst fear - the "second death", or eternal restlessness. In some versions, the condemned are swallowed whole by Ammit, doomed to forever digest in Ammit's stomach. Some believe this could be an early incarnation of the Christian ideal of the Lake Of Fire.

Ammit's appearance is a reflection of her role as devourer, being a composite of the most vicious animals in Egypt. Ammit is also associated with Tawaret, the hippopotamus goddess responsible for warding off evil, and Sekhmet, goddess of the sun and fire, due to her lioness aspect.

Although Ammit was feared and regarded as a demon, her role illustrates the complexities of Ancient Egyptian religion. She punishes the wicked and, as such, can be seen as an agent of good. She is a representation to follow the laws of Ma'at, or divine justice and harmony. Amun - Ra
