Academic Hematologist, Specializing in Malignant Blood Disorders

The McMaster Department of Oncology, in conjunction with Hamilton Health Sciences is currently recruiting an Academic Hematologist specializing in malignant blood disorders to join the Division of Malignant Hematology.

The Division of Malignant Hematology consists of ten geographic full-time hematologists located at the Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre who are engaged in clinical practice, education and research. The Division is responsible for treating malignant blood diseases as well as providing autologous and allogeneic hematopoietic stem cell transplantation to the central-west region of Ontario and beyond. There is a variety of teaching opportunities at the undergraduate and postgraduate level.

The JCC has a large Clinical Trials Department contributing to phase I through phase III clinical trials through the Canadian Clinical Trials Group, the Ontario Clinical Oncology Group, industry-sponsored trials and investigator-initiated clinical trials. The successful applicant would be expected to participate and enrol patients in the clinical trials program. Multiple opportunities exist for clinical and health services research. The academic Department of Oncology is closely aligned with the Escarpment Cancer Research Institute (ECRI), an interdisciplinary research institute that supports collaborative cancer research and provides access to experts in clinical trials, translational and health services research methods.

The successful applicant will have a primary focus in the treatment of myeloma, lymphoma and autologous stem cell transplantation, but should also be knowledgeable in other areas of malignant hematology. They will see outpatients in the Juravinski Cancer Centre and rotate as ward attending on the inpatient service in the Juravinski Hospital along with nurse practitioners, hematology and other residents. The attending rotation will also include general hematology consultations for the hospital. Further post-graduate Masters' level or fellowship training in the realm of health service research, quality/patient safety, clinical trials or education would be an asset.

Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification in Hematology, by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Candidates must have an MD or equivalent, and must be licensed or eligible for licensure in the province of Ontario. Academic rank and appointment category will be commensurate with training and experience. This position will be funded through the Provincial Oncology Alternate Payment Plan.

All qualified applicants are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: "Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada" or "No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada"
