New Jersey v. T.L.O. / Setting the Stage: Bell-Ringer Activity

As you walk into class, you observe this conversation between your teacher and one of your classmates:

Teacher:	You smell like cigarette smoke. Have you been smoking?
Student:	Me? No way. I don't smoke.
Teacher:	I don't believe you. Let me have your backpack. I'm going to call security and have them check it for cigarettes.
Student:	You're kidding me, right? I didn't do anything wrong. Plus, they can't search me without a warrant.
At this point, a security guard enters the room and approaches the student.	
Guard:	Come with me and bring your backpack. We're going to search it.

Questions to Consider

- 1. What do you think about the event that just occurred? Was the student treated fairly?
- 2. The student claimed that security cannot conduct a search without a warrant. Do you think this is true? Why or why not?
- 3. Do you think the rules that police must follow regarding searches apply to school officials too? Should the same rules apply? Why or why not?
