## **Bryan City Council Still Ironing Out BioMedical Corridor Agreement**

They're wrapping up executive session as of 10 P.M. after meeting behind closed <u>doors</u> <u>door</u>

They also held a public hearing on a proposal for the corridor near Highway 47 and University 2 Drive.

The cities would split the costs of water, sewer and other  $\underline{\text{infrastructure}}$   $\mathbf{Z}$ , and would also share property tax revenue on the land in question.

"Really what this does is give us the opportunity to diversify our economy, add a ton of jobs to our community and just increase our tax base, increase the revenue that's brought in to our community and just expand the opportunities for students going to Texas A&M to stay here after graduation," said Chris Peterson, Brazos Valley Partnership Board of Directors Chairman-Elect.

The College Station City Council approved its version of the inter-local agreement last week.
