A trademark is generally a word, phrase, symbol, or design, or a combination thereof, that identifies and distinguishes the source of the goods of one party from those of others. •

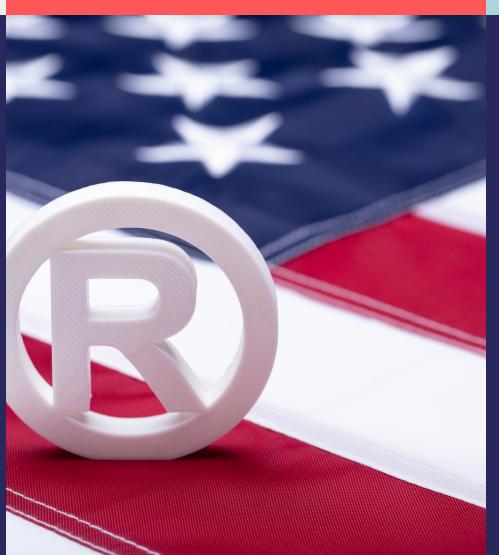


The More Unique A Trademark the Better

Trademark Rights...

Unlike other countries in the United States trademark rights are acquired by the use of the trademark in commerce and also by registration.

Use is fundamental for legal protection



Why do We need Registration?

Although use in commerce creates Common Law rigths registration gives trademark owners a more stronger legal protection against unauthorized use.



Benefits of Trademark Registration

Discourages others from using confusingly similar marks

The trademark is easy to find and the registation is a basis for refusal of other registrations that are similar



Evidence of the validity and exclusive ownership of the mark

Trademark litigation can be very expensive. A trademark registration can end a litigation before it may commence.

A trademark registration is the best basis for a Cease and Desist Letter.

Ability to request statutory damages in the case of counterfeiting.

In litigation a party usually must offer evidence of damages to recover. A trademark registration allows a trademark owner to request the damages stablished by law and there is no need to prove actual damages.

Provides a basis for foreign registrations, facilitating protection of a marks worldwide as your business expands.

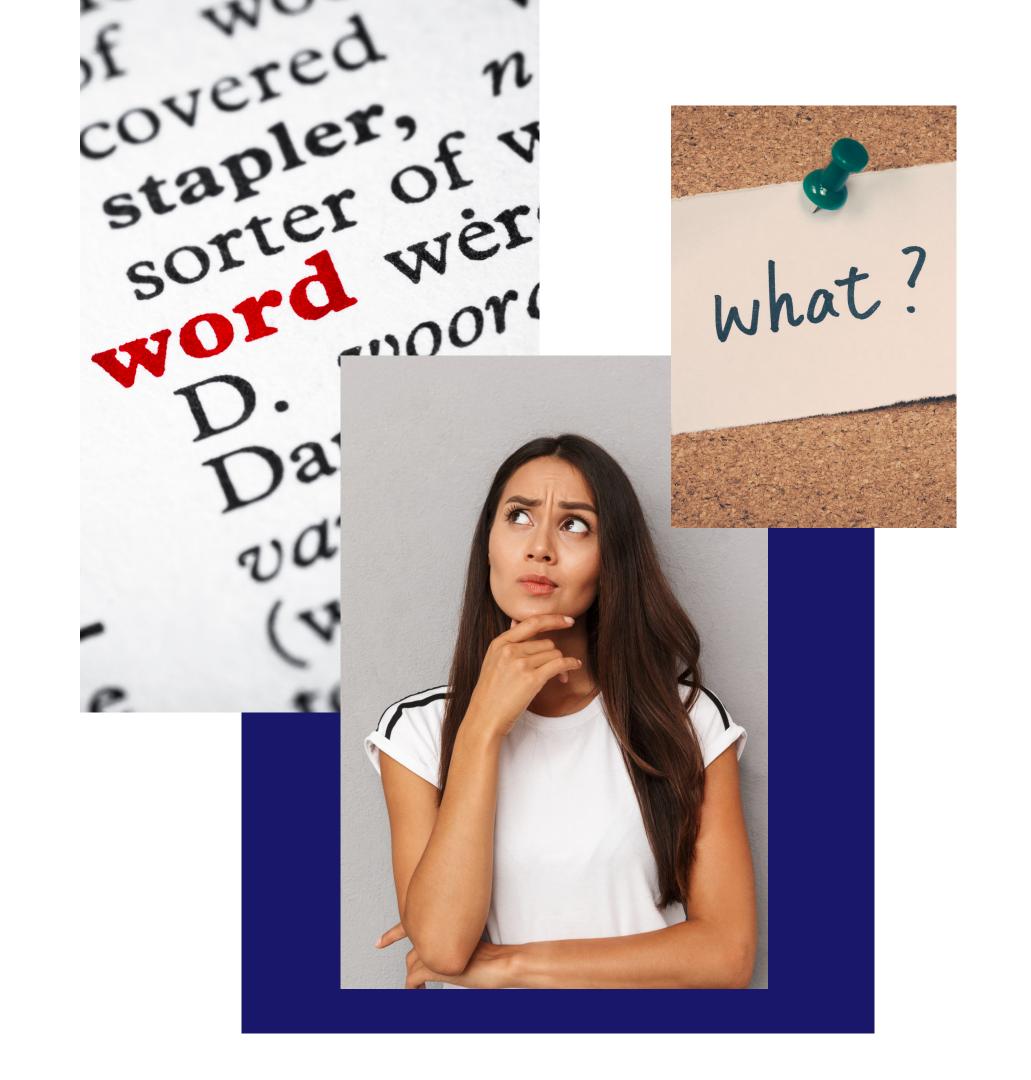




Companies register trademarks every day why they make mistakes and lose money?

1. Lack of Understanding About the Level of Distinctivity of Trademarks

- **Generic Marks**: Use a common word for a product or service.
- **Descriptive Marks:** Describe, per the United States Patent and Trademark Office, an "ingredient, quality, characteristic, function, feature, purpose, or use of the specified goods or services."
- **Suggestive Marks:** Need imagination, thought, or perception to arrive at an understanding of what the mark represents.
- **Arbitrary Marks:** Have no relation to the goods or services the mark represents.
- Fanciful Marks: Consist of a coined phrase or invented name.



Generic Trademarks

A generic trademarks is incapable of acquiring distinctiveness.

Descriptive Marks

The major reasons for not protecting such marks are:

- (1) to prevent the owner of a mark from inhibiting competition in the sale of particular goods; and
- (2) to maintain freedom of the public to use the language involved, thus avoiding the possibility of harassing infringement suits by the registrant against others who use the mark when advertising or describing their own products.

Suggestive Marks

Suggestive marks are those that, when applied to the goods or services at issue, require imagination, thought, or perception to reach a conclusion as to the nature of those goods or services. Thus, a suggestive term differs from a descriptive term, which immediately tells something about the goods or services.

Fanciful and Arbitrary Marks

Fanciful marks comprise terms that have been invented for the sole purpose of functioning as a trademark or service mark. Such marks comprise words that are either unknown in the language or are completely out of common usage.

Arbitrary marks comprise words that are in common linguistic use but, when used to identify particular goods or services, do not suggest or describe a significant ingredient, quality, or characteristic of the goods or services.









2. Incorrect or Inconsistent Description of Services or Products or the mark



The Examining Attorney does not know your product or service...

Ambiguity or lack of clarity can negatively impact your trademark registration

What do we need to understand?

There is list that of classes fr each kind of goods and services.

The definition must be coherent to waht the applicant actually promotes with the trademark.

USPTO Non-Final Action

Registration is refused because the specimen in International Class 28 is merely a photocopy of the drawing or a picture or rendering of the applied-for mark, and thus fails to show the applied-for mark in use in commerce with the goods for each international class.

Class 16: Class 16: Paper goods and Printed Matter



USPTO Non-Final Action

The wording "office supplies and school supplies" in the identification of goods needs clarification because it is too broad and could include goods classified in other international classes.

Applicant Correction:

Proposed: Class 016 for Office supplies and school supplies, namely, pens, pencils, highlighting markers, felt tip markers, drawing brushes, paint brushes, binder clips, paper clips, push pins, erasers, pencil holders, drawing compasses, scissors, shipping labels, rulers, paper hole punchers, pencil sharpeners, staplers

Description: Office supplies and school supplies.

Class 16: Class 16: Paper goods and Printed Matter



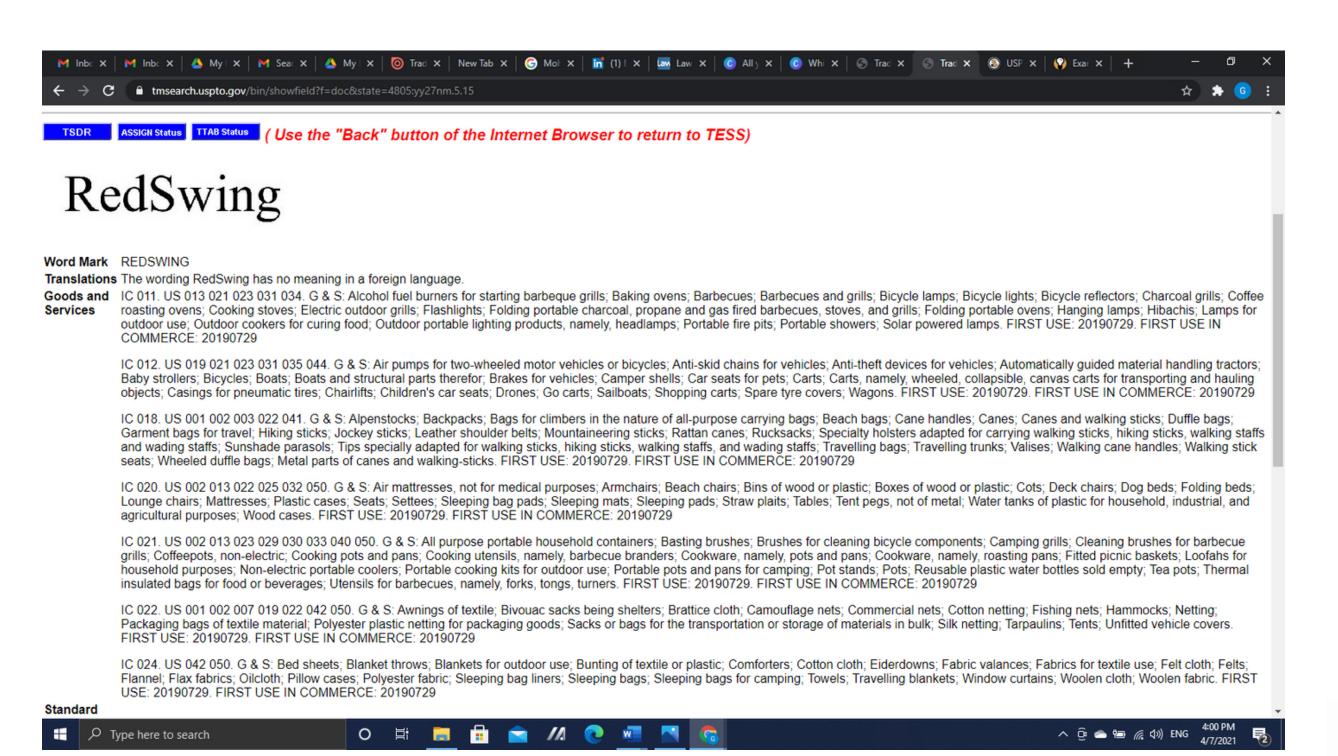
USPTO Second Non-Final Action

The wording "rulers" in the identification of goods needs clarification because it is too broad and could include goods classified in other international classes. The applicant must identify each and every type of ruler it will provide to consumers and classify the goods accordingly.

Additionally, scissors are properly classified in International Class 8.

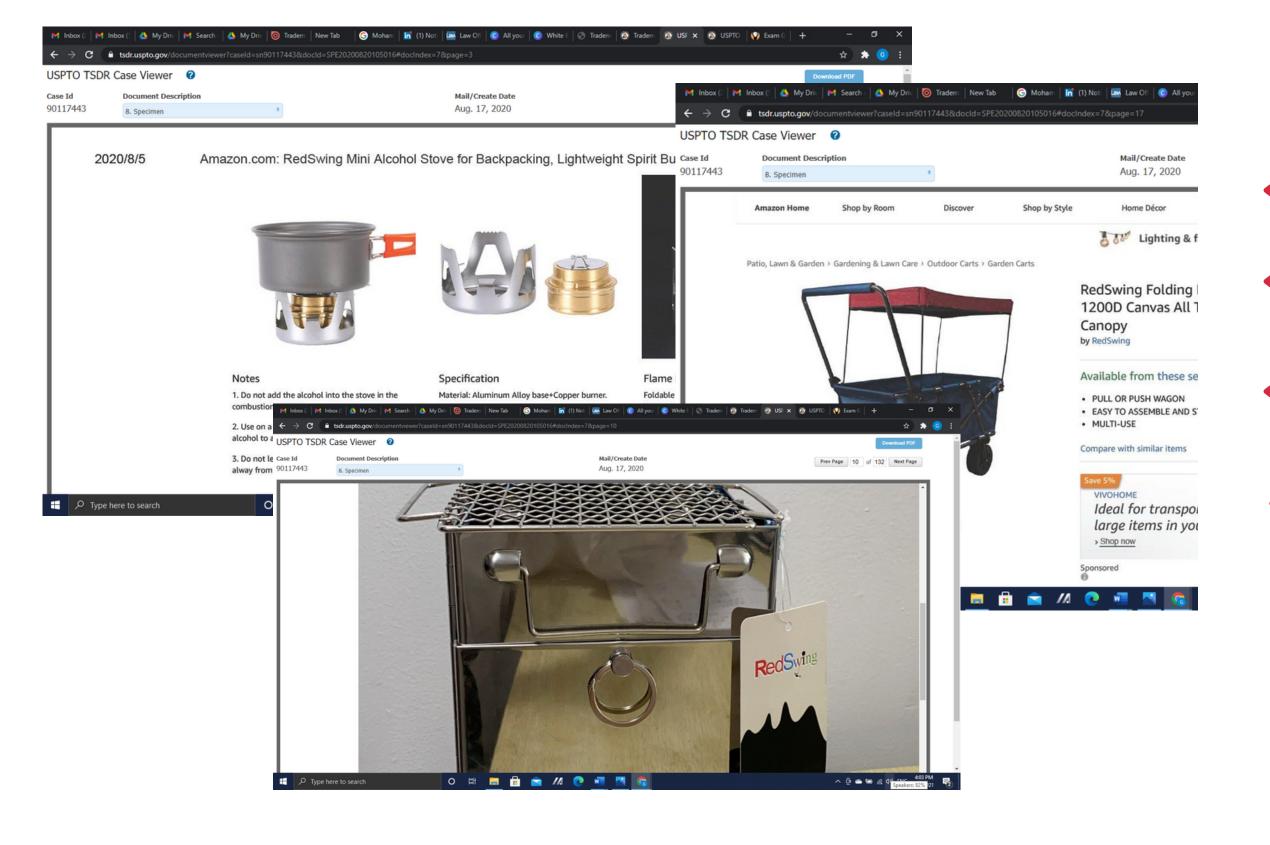

Note: Any mark whose drawing includes broken lines must have a printed description.

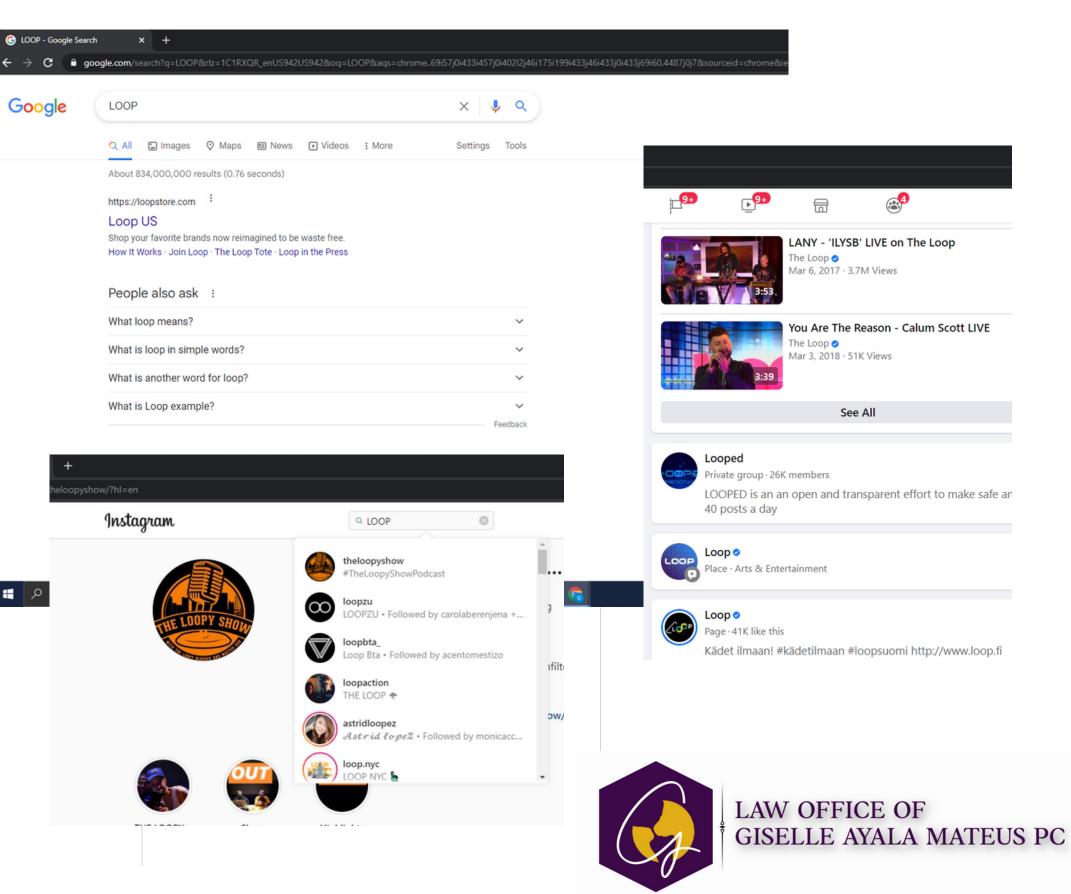

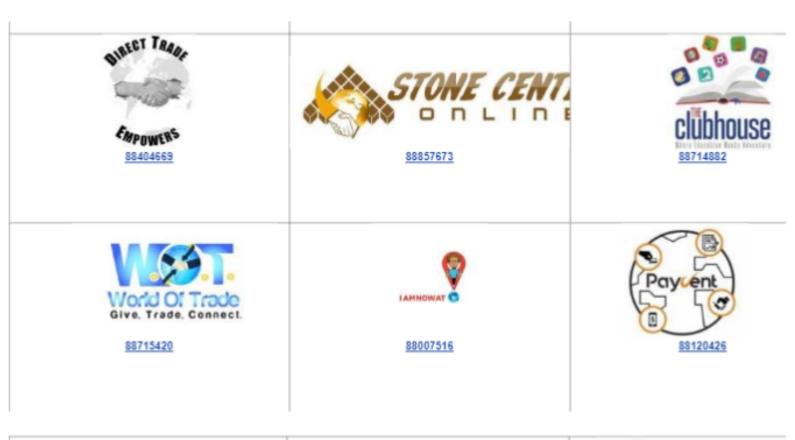

To evaluate the distinctiveness of the mark and any possible ground for refusal on the basis of likelihood of confusson.







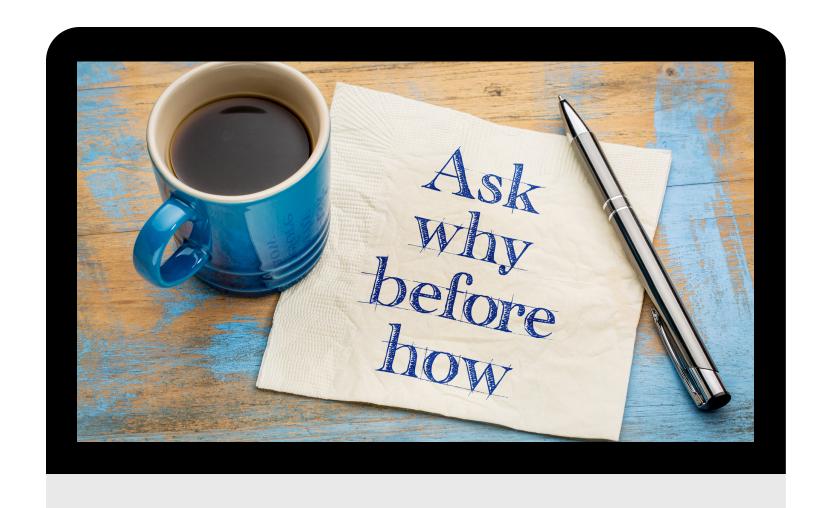




Benefits of Trademark Clearance Report

A preliminary trademark clearance reports allows you to:

- Anticipate possible grounds for refusal.
- Anticipates defenses to over come refusals such as, likelihood of confusion, the most common.
- Avoid waste money applications.
- Avoid trademarks that are weak.



4. Selection of a plain word trademark in a crowded market or when using names



A logo or other added elements can make the difference

A trademark is group of different elements

Sometimes the more elaborated the trademark the better.

USPTO Makes an Overall Analysis of the Mark

When it comes to the analysis of a trademark courts and attorneys consider the marks "in their entireties as to appearance, sound, connotation and commercial impression."

Words Accompanied by a logo have better chance to be registered

The commercial impression of trademark is usually visual. However, there are simple and single words that may convey a strong impression.

Crowded Markets...

There are market where the use of certain words is necessary to create trust in the customer of a service or a product,

A trademark with an stylized font and other added elements makes a better case before an examining attorney.

Names...

No trademark by which the goods of the applicant may be distinguished from the goods of others shall be refused registration on the principal register on account of its nature unless it . . . (c) Consists of or comprises a name, portrait, or signature identifying a particular living individual except by his written consent, or the name, signature, or portrait of a deceased President of the United States during the life of his widow, if any, except by the written consent of the widow.

Whether consent to registration is required depends on whether the public would recognize and understand the mark as identifying a particular living individual. Specifically, a consent is required only if the individual will be associated with the goods or services, because the person is publicly connected with the business in which the mark is used, or is so well known that the public would reasonably assume a connection.

The use different elements can make a better case for the registration involving a name.



4. Wrongful believe that a descriptive trademark is unprotectable





(1) Use of the registration symbol ® with the registered mark in connection with the designated goods and/or services, which provides public notice of the registration and potentially deters third parties from using confusingly similar marks.

(2) Inclusion of the registered mark in the USPTO's database of registered and pending marks, which will (a) make it easier for third parties to find it in trademark search reports, (b) provide public notice of the registration, and thus (c) potentially deter third parties from using confusingly similar marks.

(3) Use of the registration by a USPTO trademark examining attorney as a bar to registering confusingly similar marks in applications filed by third parties.

- (4) Use of the registration as a basis to bring suit for trademark infringement in federal court, which, although more costly than state court, means judges with more trademark experience, often faster adjudications, and the opportunity to seek an injunction, actual damages, and attorneys' fees and costs.
- (5) Use of the registration as a filing basis for a trademark application for registration in certain foreign countries, in accordance with international treaties.

4. Wrongful believe that a descriptive trademark is unprotectable





Make a Plan

It is fundamental that you make a plan because a trademark registration iscan be constly, specially if you do not anticipate grounds for refusal.



Any report is better than no report

A clearance report can answer many questions

About registrability, possible denials, how crowded is the market, what possible oppositions you may encounter among others.



The ideal would be to register your trademark with the help on an attorney

It is a best practice to have an attorney. However, you can start on your own do research and USE your mark, that is fundamental to obtain registration.
