



Help Develop The Pipeline

Lawyers of color comprise approximately 12% of lawyers nationally. The law student pipeline has increased only minimally in the last several years. Because many students of color have a limited number of lawyer role models in their families and communities, attaining a diverse lawyer population requires reaching out to middle and high school students to interest them in the profession and expose them to the possibility of a legal career.

The Arizona Minority Bar Association is initiating a student mentor program that will allow lawyers to work with a student while providing total flexibility to accommodate the lawyer's schedule and preferred time commitment. Unlike many programs that require an established weekly or monthly commitment, this program will allow anything from a one-time visit to a regularly designated meeting or even meeting two or three times a year.

Lawyers will be paired with a student from City High School located in downtown Tucson. City High has a diverse student body. Approximately half of the students qualify for a free or reduced lunch program and an equal number would be the first in their families to go to college.

The program provides the opportunity for students to observe lawyers at a court hearing or trial. If preferred, the student is also able to visit at a law office or other location of the lawyer's choosing. The School will transport the student to and from the Court or location of the meeting.
