THE DIRTY DOZEN

□ Make sure everyone is okay. □ Call 911 no matter how insignificant or small the accident appears. □ Get the contact information from all people at the scene. □ Get the other driver's insurance information. □ Do not speak to the investigating law enforcement officer in front of the other driver or witnesses. □ Do not speak to the other driver or witnesses about the facts the accident. □ If EMS comes to the scene and you're hurting - let the paramedics check you out. □ If you are physically able, be sure to document the scene of the accident with pictures or video. □ If you're hurting, get checked out immediately you could have something going on under the surface that will require medical attention. □ Report the accident to your insurance company even if you were not at fault for the crash. \square Do not give a recorded statement to the other insurance company without first speaking to a lawver. □ Contact a car accident lawyer to learn about your rights.
