LEADERSHIP TRAIT - CREATIVITY

A great leader has the ability to creatively create positive experiences for others.

LEADERSHIP LESSON

Your children will learn that God made them to create.

LEADERSHIP STORY

The Building of the Tabernacle. (*Exodus 25 - 31*)

MEMORY VERSE:

Help your children memorize this verse.

"When God created human beings, he made them to be like himself." Genesis 5:1b (NLT)

First:

Read the Leadership Story to your children. The Leadership Story for this lesson is about God's plans for the Tabernacle and is found in Exodus 31:1-11.

Next:

Have your children watch the Leadership Video, *God Made Me To Create*.

Then:

Ask your children the Child Leadership Questions, and lead your family through the Optional Family Activity.



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CONTINUED

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Child Leadership Questions:

1. How many men did God put in charge of building the Tabernacle?
(Two.)
2. Did God give these men special abilities to create?
(Yes.)
3. Name some of the things that the men built for the Tabernacle?
(Furniture. Bowls. Lamps. Curtains. Tent. Clothes. Jewelry. Perfume.)
4. You may not be able to create all the things that Bezalel and Oholiab created for the Tabernacle, but God still made you to create. Tell me some things you can create.
(Make a card for someone. A snack. Draw a picture. Build something with my blocks.)

OPTIONAL FAMILY ACTIVITY: CREATION WALK

It is amazing to think about all of the things God created! As a family, take a walk outside and point out all of the things you see that God created. Make sure to notice the different types of trees, flowers, and birds. God is the creator of the world, and He is the source of creativity. He made you, the birds, cats, and dogs. But God didn't make just one type of those things. He made many different types. God is very creative. God made us to be like Him, so we know we are creative, too. God wants us to use the creativity He has given us.

While on your walk, have family members collect different items from nature and place them in a small bag. When you return home, create something unique using the items your family collected. You could glue them on poster board to make a wall hanging, or connect them with string to make a mobile to hang from the ceiling, or glue them together to make a sculpture. Put your unique item up for display somewhere in your house to remind your whole family that God designed each of you to be creative!
