LEADERSHIP TRAIT - PRAYER

Great leaders know that no problems are too big for God to solve, and all problems should be taken to God in prayer.

LEADERSHIP LESSON

The children will learn that when we encounter problems that we cannot handle on our own, we should pray and ask God for help.

LEADERSHIP STORY

Hannah prayed earnestly for God to give her a son. She was patient and waited on God to fulfill Eli's promise. (1 Samuel 1)

WHAT DO I DO?

Have your children read the Leadership Story. Next, have your children watch the Leadership Video and complete the Child Leadership Questions. If you want to do the Optional Family Activity, have the whole family watch the Leadership Video, then lead your family through the Optional Family Activity.

OPTIONAL FAMILY ACTIVITY PRAY WITHOUT STOPPING

This week, give each family member an index card and have each person write down two or three prayer requests on a card. Take a large piece of paper or a poster board and glue the index cards onto it. Have each family member share his or her prayer requests as you glue on the cards. After all the cards are on the paper, make a circle and take turns praying for each of the prayer requests. Put the poster up somewhere in your house to remind each person to continue to pray for the requests without stopping until an answer is given. As each prayer is answered, circle the request on the paper. Remind your children that God wants us to pray to Him about all things, and that we should pray until an answer is given.
