LEADERSHIP TRAIT - SENSE OF PURPOSE

Understanding God has created everything helps a leader know that they have a place in the world and that God has a plan and purpose for them.

LEADERSHIP LESSON

Your children will learn that God made the Sun, Moon, and stars.

LEADERSHIP STORY

The creation of the Sun, Moon, and stars. (*Genesis 1:14-19*)

MEMORY VERSE

Help your children memorize this verse.

"Then God looked over all he had made, and he saw that it was very good." Genesis 1:31a (NLT)

First:

Read the Leadership Story about the creation of the Sun, Moon, and stars from Genesis 1:14-19 to your children.

Next:

Let your children watch The Leadership Video, *God Made The Sun Moon And Stars*.

Then:

Ask your children the Child Leadership Questions, and lead your family through the Optional Family Activity.

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Child Leadership Questions:

1. Arty Morty was trying to trick people into thinking something about the Moon and stars. What was he tricking people into thinking?
(That they are bad.)
2. Swanson told Roanoke about how the Sun, Moon, and stars were made. Who made the Sun, Moon, and stars?
(God.)
3. Did God say the Sun, Moon, and stars were good, or did He say they were bad?
(He said they were good.)

OPTIONAL FAMILY ACTIVITY: UP IN THE AIR PRAYER

One day this week, take your child outside several different times. Look at the sky when the Sun is rising, when it is out all the way, when it is setting, and when it is gone and the Moon and stars are out. Say a prayer each time you look at the sky to thank God for creating the Sun, Moon, and stars.

- What lights the earth during the day?
(The Sun.)
- What lights the earth during the night?
(The Moon and stars.)
- Who made the Sun, Moon, and stars?
(God.)

God made the Sun, Moon, and stars and said that they are good. We can thank God for giving us the Sun, Moon, and stars.
