#### **LEADERSHIP TRAIT - SENSE OF PURPOSE**

#### **Child Leadership Questions:**

- 1. What did God make on the fifth day of creation? (Fish and birds.)
- 2. What did the fish and the birds do to fill the earth? (Have baby fish and baby birds.)
- 3. After God looked at His creation, what did He see? (That it was good.)
- 4. What do birds do to help plants grow? (They fly around spreading seeds.)
- 5. What is one way that fish are good? (They are beautiful. They swim around in funny ways.)

#### **OPTIONAL FAMILY ACTIVITY: BIRD FEEDER**

Sometime this week, make a bird feeder with your children and hang it outside where you can see it often. Whenever you see birds near it, remind your children that God made all the birds that fly in the air, and all the fish that swim in the water. Tell your children, when you see these things, to say a prayer of thanks to God. A simple bird feeder can be made by putting peanut butter or corn syrup on a pine cone, rolling it in birdseed, and hanging it in a tree. God made the fish and birds and said that they are good. We can thank God for the fish and the birds.
