Child Leadership Questions:

Jesus was eating dinner at the home of Lazarus. While he was there, what did Mary do for Jesus? (She poured an expensive bottle of perfume on Jesus' feet.)

What did she do after she poured the bottle of perfume on Jesus' feet? (She wiped His feet off with her hair.)

Why did Mary do this for Jesus? (She wanted to show honor to Him and to show that she was glad He was there.)

Mary gave something of hers to Jesus, but someone was not happy that she did that. Who was angry about what Mary gave? (Judas.)

What did Judas think Mary should have done with the bottle of perfume? (Sell it.)

Jesus told Judas that Mary did the right thing by giving her bottle of perfume to show honor to Jesus. We can be like Mary and give our things to others when we see that they need something.

OPTIONAL FAMILY ACTIVITY: GIFTS TO GIVE

God wants us to give to others, like Mary gave to Jesus. This week, work together as a family and make a list of some items you have that others might need. Walk through the house with your children and help them point out different items to put on the list. Decide on one of those things and give it to someone who needs it. Encourage your children to give to others just as Mary gave her own special gift to Jesus.
