

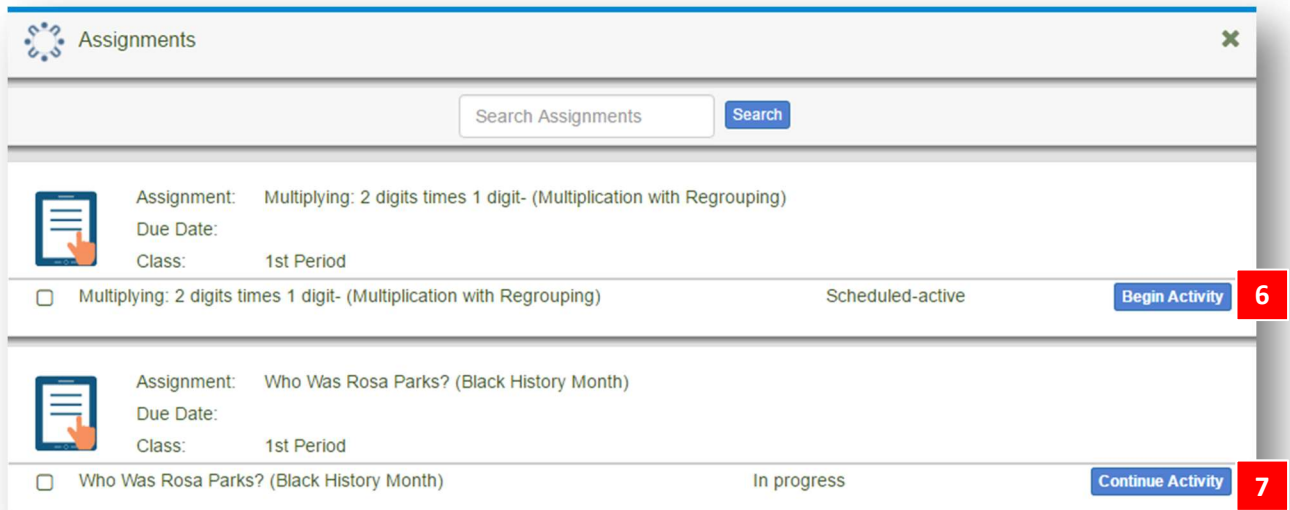
Students log into District and School Connect by going to <https://app.gcaconnect.org>.

1. Students will enter the username and password provide by the classroom teacher. Usernames and passwords are case sensitive. Eliminate any blank spaces before or after username or password.
2. Select Sign In.

3. At the top of the menu, the assigning teacher's name is displayed.
4. Select Assignments to view the Assignments from the teacher.
5. Select Results to view results from completed Activities.

Note: Parents may use student's username and password to login to their child's account to view Results.

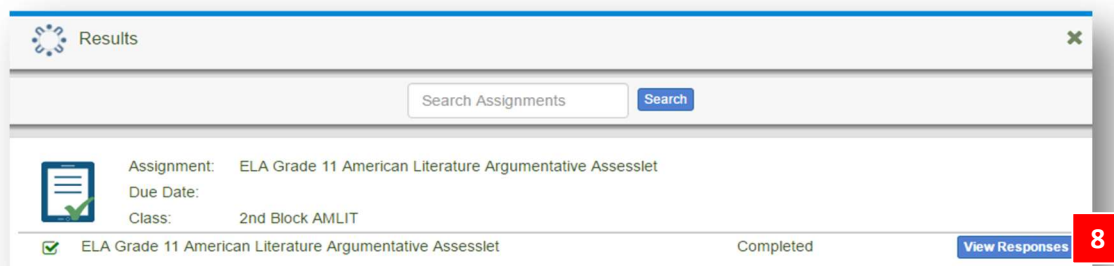
6. Students may begin an assigned Activity by selecting Begin Activity.
7. Students who had begun an Activity and selected the Save and Continue button are able to continue working on the Activity by selecting the Continue Activity button.

Note: Once a student has selected the Finish button, the Activity is submitted for scoring and students no longer have access to the Assignment.

Tips:

Students are only able to view Activities that are active. Teachers may schedule times and dates Activities are active.

Students will only have access to GCA Assesslets during the testing window. However, they may view results at any time.



8. To view results, select Results from the left menu, then select View Responses.
