



This Week's Icebreaker Question:

Would you prefer to visit Earth in 2100 or travel back to 1900?

Series Questions:

1. What has God revealed to you?
2. What are you doing about it?
3. How is it changing your life?

Sermon Specific Questions:

1. Read Romans 10:14-21. At times, we can think of missional work and outreach as, "someone else's job," but it's the job of every believer. What can we do to model both giving out the Gospel ourselves and encouraging others to do so? Who in your life needs to hear the Good News of the Gospel? How can you share the Gospel with them?
2. Read Romans 10:16. Share a time when you received some good advice or perhaps a warning, and you listened to that advice. Share a time when you didn't listen and suffered the consequences. Have you, "obeyed the Gospel?" If not, why not? What are the benefits of obedience? What is the cost of disobedience?
3. Read Romans 10:17. What does it mean to hear through the Word of Christ in this passage? Is the emphasis on "hearing" or the on the "Word of Christ" or both? What is our most important calling as a church and how can you personally help to move the Word of God forward through the ministry of James River Church?
4. Read Roman 10:19-21 and Deuteronomy 32:21. Why does Israel not seem to understand the message that has been proclaimed to them over and over? How does God use the Gentiles (those who are not Jews) to provoke the Israelites to jealousy? How does this apply to us today? What is our role in proclaiming the message versus God's role?
5. Read Romans 10:21. What does this verse say God is doing concerning His people Israel? What does it show us about the character of God and His people? How can we help others see the beauty of the Gospel gift that God is offering us?
